PREFACE

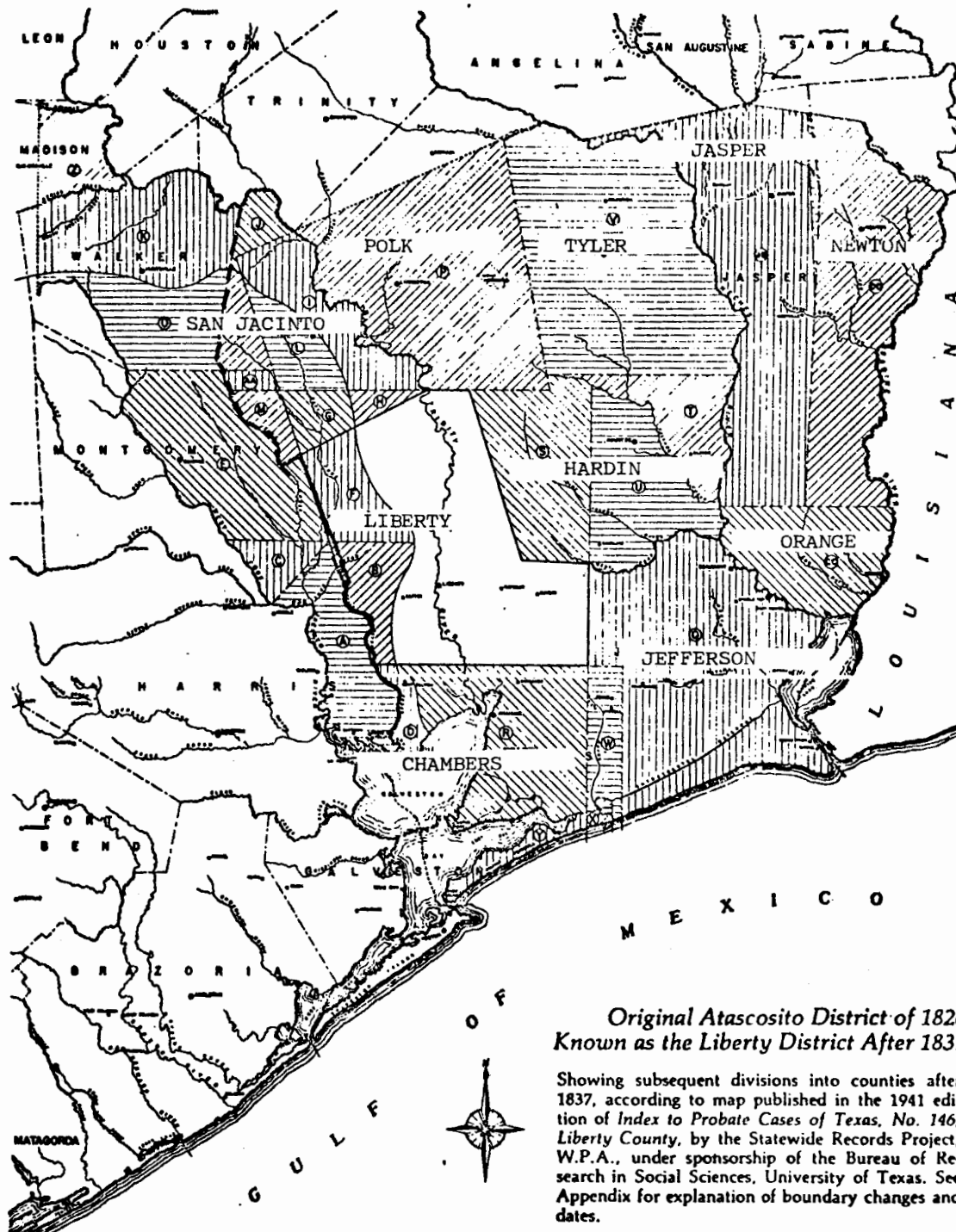

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INTRODUCTION

Jefferson County is located in southeast Texas, bounded on the east by the Neches River and on the south by the Gulf of Mexico. It was created in 1836. The soil ranges from grassy, timbered plains in the northwest to beach sands, sandy loams and black clay soils. Camping, hunting and fishing are prime recreational resources.

Rice accounts for most of the farm income with cattle and soybeans ranking 2nd and 3rd. Petrochemicals dominate the economy with chemical plants, refineries, oil field supplies leading. The Bethlehem Shipyard is a major builder of off-shore rigs. Port Arthur and Beaumont are major ports in Texas.

At the beginning of the 20th century, timber was the dominate factor in the economy. Many saw mill towns have disappeared, and the land given over to rice fields.



This book presents an overall survey of burial sites within Jefferson County, Texas with sources cited. The large cemeteries, i.e, Magnolia Cemetery and Forest Lawn Cemetery in Beaumont, Greenlawn-Johnson Cemeteries in Port Arthur, have not been physically surveyed as records are available.

Publication of surveys of cemeteries numbered 34-43 are being considered as possible Black History projects for the local high school history classes and are not included.

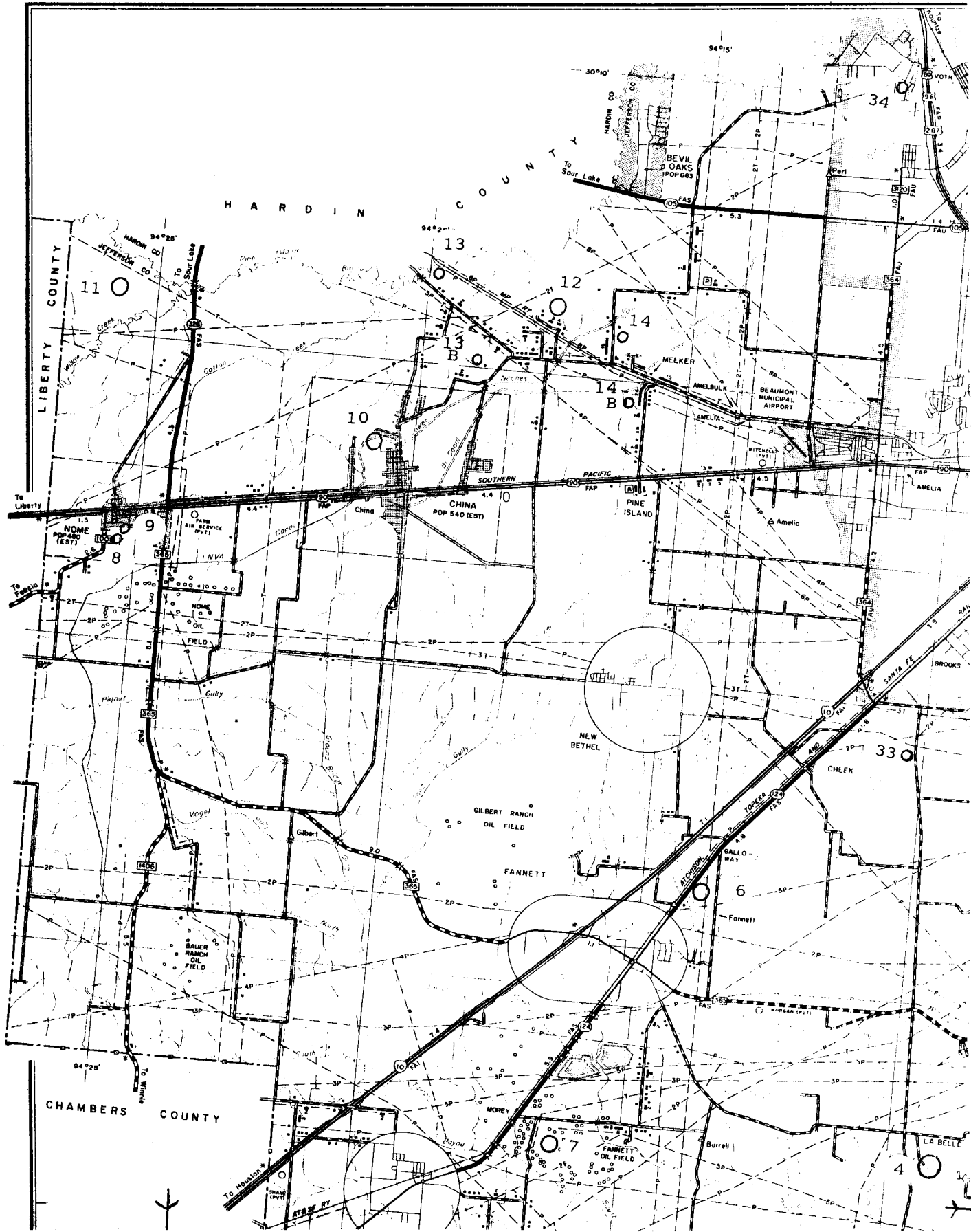
In using information, dates on stones may vary from other sources. If a stonecutter made a mistake, it was generally allowed to remain. Spelling may reflect family name changes.

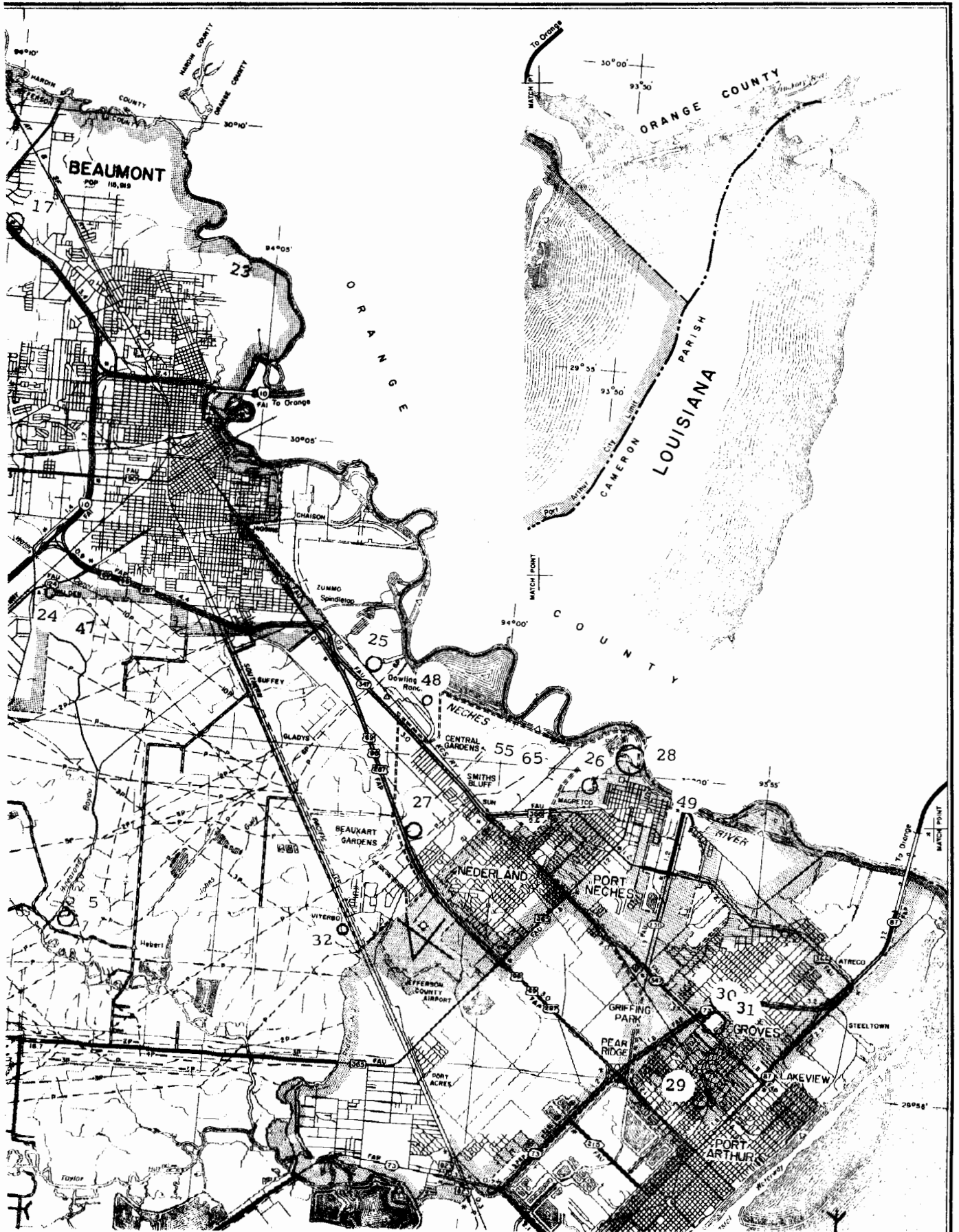

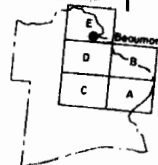
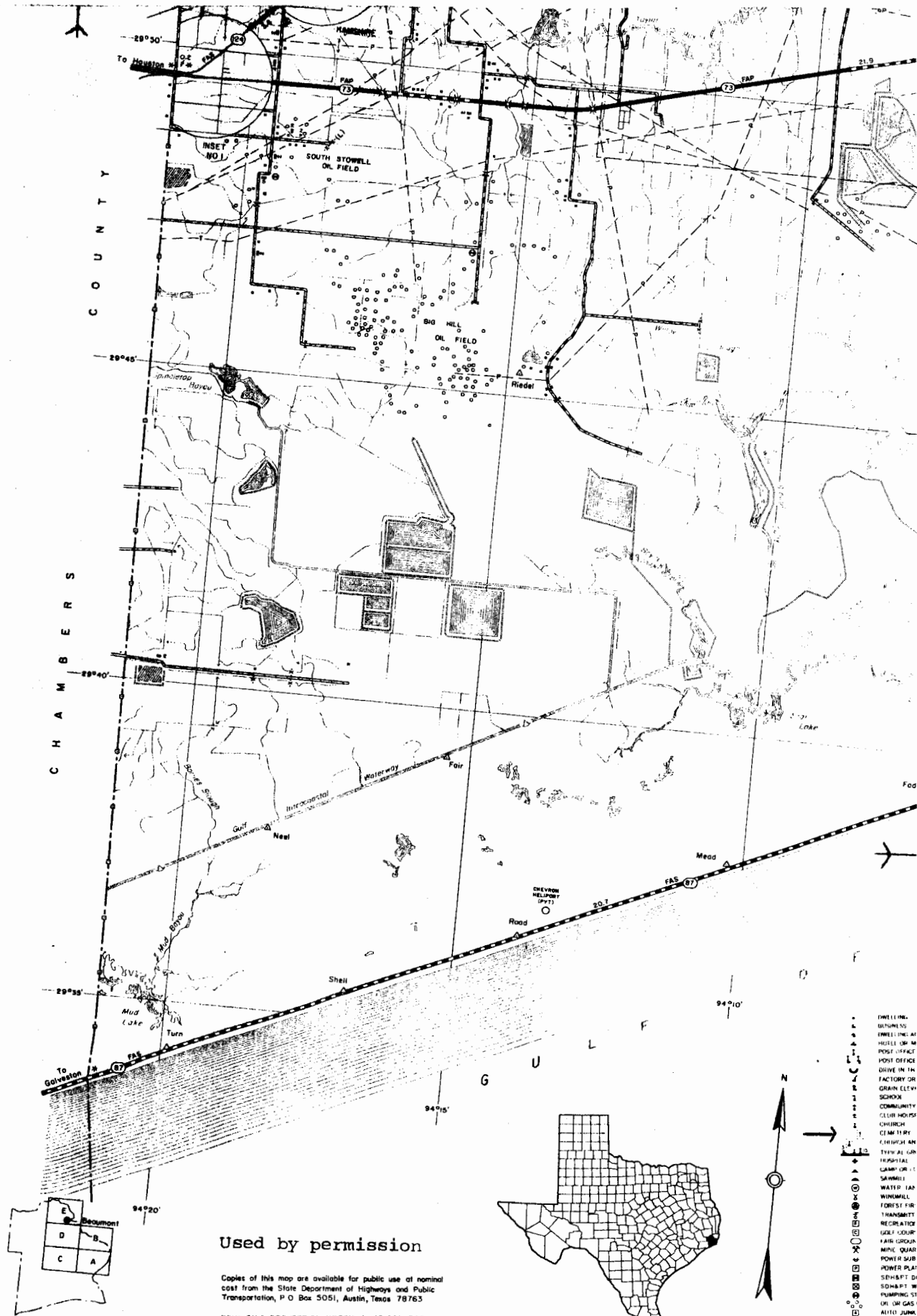


Match point map

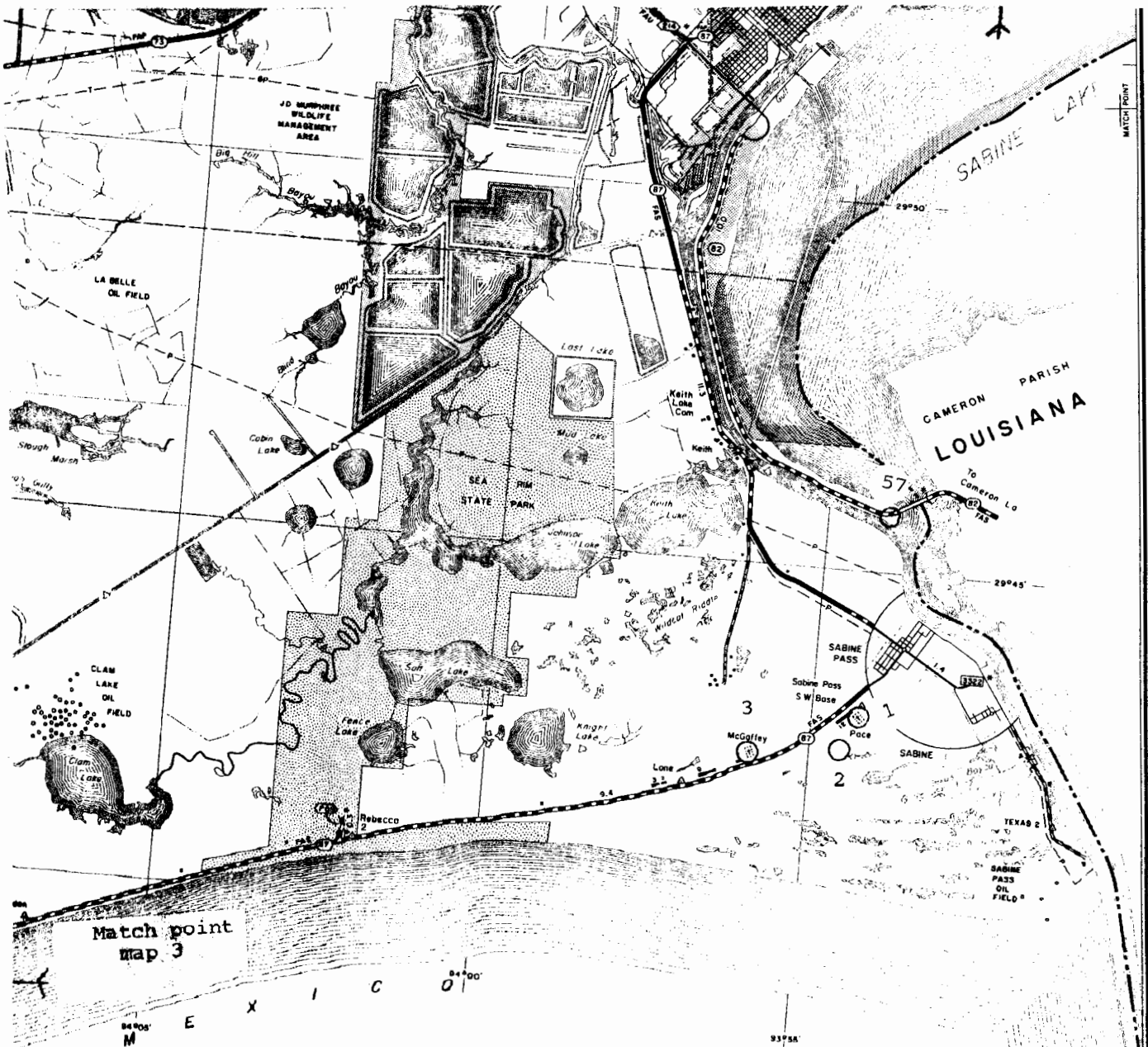

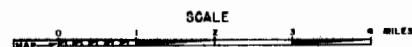

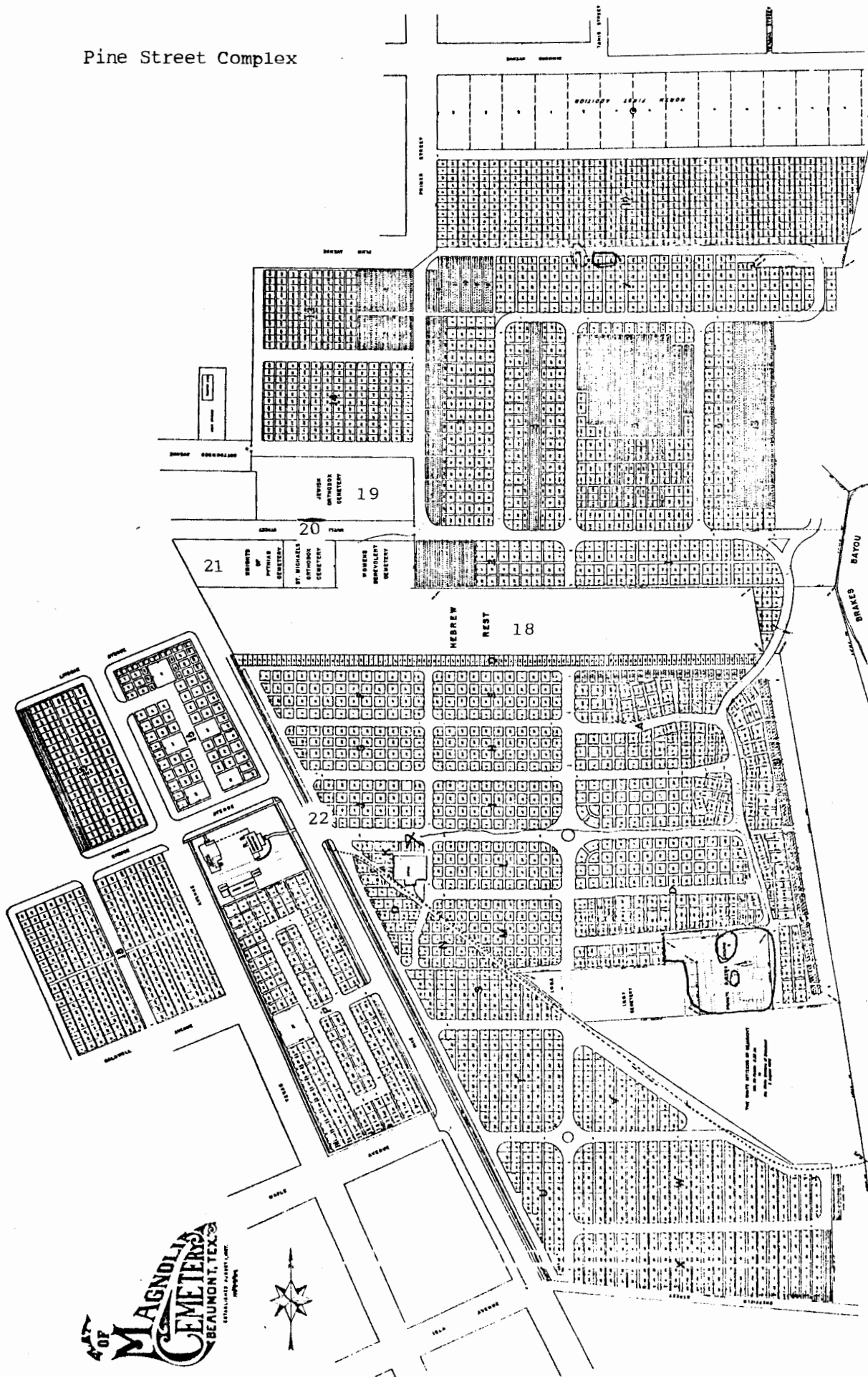

1. SABINE PASS CEMETERY (PACE)

On map

read November 16, 1977

South of Highway 87, near the tanks of Scurlock Oil Company, sometimes known as Pace Cemetery, in the early 1970's a boy scout troop cleaned this cemetery. Publicity given their project resulted in vandals visiting. However, two inventories had been made prior to the vandalizing, one published in YELLOWED PAGES, Vol. I, #2, of the Southeast Texas Genealogical and Historical Society, May 1971. An accompanying article by Mr. W. T. Block, Jefferson County historian, identified some unmarked burials. Mrs. Will (Rosine) Wilson of the Jefferson County Historical Commission had a second inventory that differed slightly from Mr. Block's records.

KNODELL, Lewis P. fenced, vandalized, legible: "energetic hunter and accomplished violinist"

from Mrs. Wilson: "To the memory of the energetic hunter and accomplished violinist Lewis P. Knodell who in company with his true friend and schoolfellow Augs. The 1925 Beaumont City Directory locates this cemetery as "east side of Collier's Ferry Road, between Caldwell and Spruce."

W.P.H.McFaddin deeded 2 1/2 acres in 1876 for a public cemetery. The Magnolia Cemetery Company was chartered in 1887, and Mr. McFaddin deeded an additional 13 acres to the company. Over the years additional acreage has been purchased and the cemetery now comprises 44 acres, on both sides of what is now named Pine Street, originally Collier's Ferry Road.

The early records of lot owners were kept, but not of each burial. Burial permits were not required until 1911. Strict burial records were not kept until 1929, when W. Clyde King became manager of the cemetery. Identifiable burials are now cross-indexed into the records, according to Mr. Billy King, current manager.

A brief history of the cemetery is given in the Beaumont Enterprise-Journal, January 18, 1981, Section G., page 1.

EVERGREEN CEMETERY

The cemetery served as an African-American graveyard located east of 3290 Pine Street in Beaumont, Texas. This location is northeast of the intersection of Pine and Delaware Streets. (See attached Jefferson County Appraisal District Map.)

According to a plat obtained from Rosalind Hall, great-grand daughter of Milton McGaffy, who was caretaker until his death. The Evergreen Cemetery was platted in 1912 and re-platted in 1919. The original plat contained 4.82 acres of which 3.57 acres remain as a non-working cemetery. The cemetery was platted for the owners E. Adams, M.H. Hebert, and J.R. Jacobs who purchased the property from Sam Maïdu, 29th November 1911. This deed is recorded in the Jefferson County Clerk's Office, Vol. 124 - pages 603-607. The last owner of record was Clara B. Nickerson Insell. The original plat contained 25-10 feet X 20 feet sections and 330- 20 feet X 20 feet sections. Later this number was reduced to 10-10 feet X 20 feet sections and 240 - 20 feet X 20 feet sections. These present day sections contain approximately 70 unidentified surface level vaults and 141 identified gravesites. It also contains many ground depressions indicative of unmarked graves.

There are 20 military tombstones in good repair. The cemetery served as a burial for paupers, criminals, and other wards of Jefferson County.

Five tombstones contain a professionally etched emblem of a fraternal organization that could not be identified. The emblem contains the letters MT3, V'sA and names of the following chambers of the organization, Riddle Chambers-3585, Beaumont, Texas; Silver Leaf Chambers-4770, Galveston, Texas; Bradley Chambers-2605, Beaumont, Texas; Lone Star Chambers-3309, Beaumont, Texas; and Queen of the Neches Chambers-4791, Beaumont, Texas.

The oldest identifiable tombstone belongs to Nettie Roach, born 1861-died October 27, 1900. The tombstone is a sculptured cement log standing on a base 6 to 8 inches in height laying on the base is a dead bird with its wing up-stretched against the log.

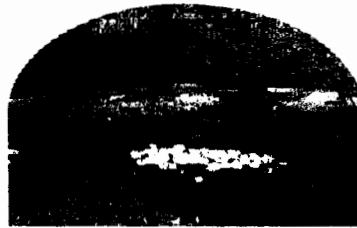

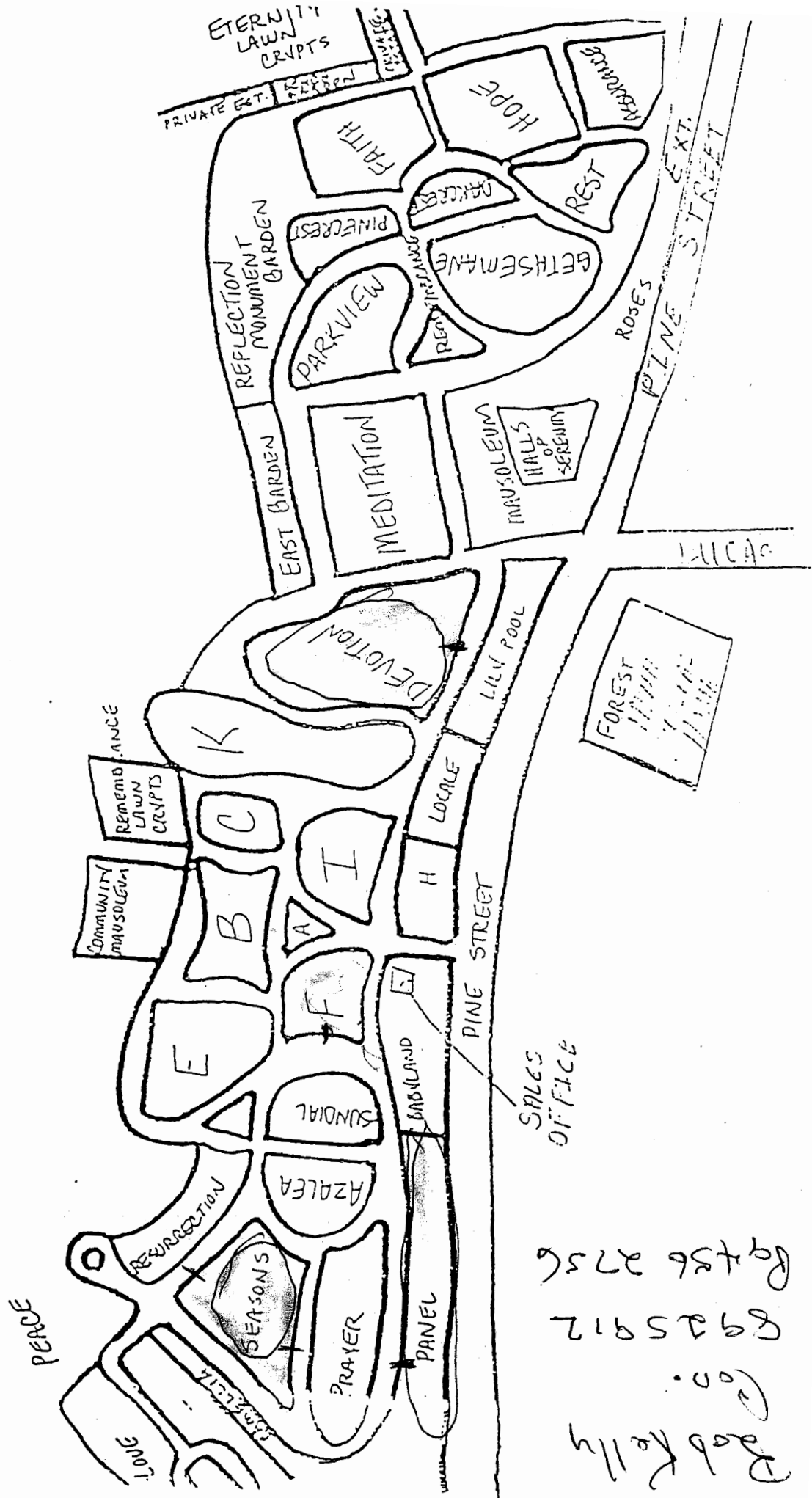

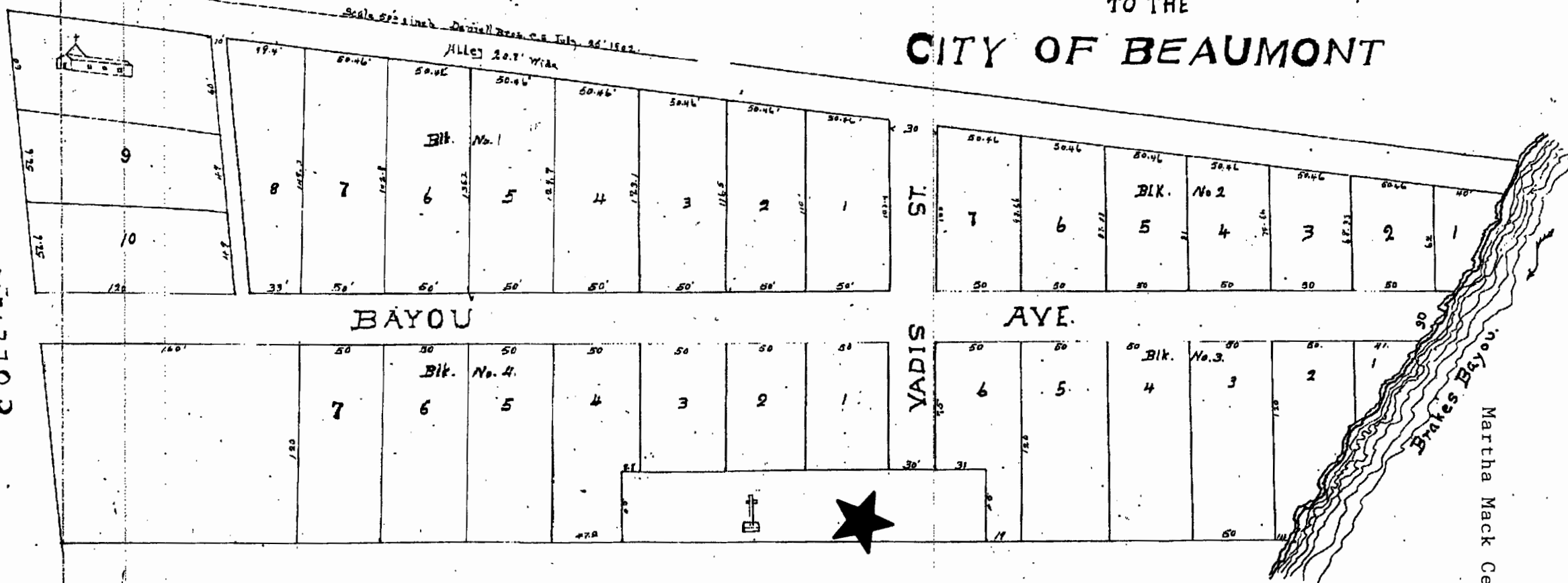

LOST

A lost cemetery in the Rosedale section of Beaumont was first identified to compiler by Mrs. Bertie (Holmes) Boodry, later confirmed by John H. Walker, both deceased. Both said it would have been in the path of the EastTex Freeway. In research the Rosedale community, Mr. L.J. (Jack) Whitmeyer did a sketch map from his mormory of the location and identified it as "LeBleu Cemetery."

The LeBleu family is identified in THE STORY OF BEAUMONT by Florence Stratton, re-printed in Beaumont, Texas 1977 by Mrs. Mary M. Withers editor of "Yellowed Pages" publication of the Southeast Texas Genealogical and Historical Society.

The progenitor of the American line was Colie LeBleu, one of the company with LaFayette. She identifies him as the great-great grandfather of Mrs. Charles J. Chaison. The 1870 published transcription of the Federal Census lists: Chaison, F age 30, wife Clara, two children, Charles 4 and William 2 and I have noted "married 9 May 1861 Clara Baldwin)

The 1880 Federal Census as printed in "Yellowed Pages", Vol. XIV No. 2, page 12 (Summer 1984) has

PIONEER REMINISCENCES OF JEFFERSON COUNTY by T.J. Russell, a compilation of his columns in BEAUMONT JOURNAL, re-printed by the S.E.T.G. & H.S., 1986, page 99 identifies Mrs. Ras Landry as the daughter of J.B. Langham.

Ras Landry was sheriff of Jefferson County From "Jefferson County Marriages" Vol II, No. 3, page 152:
#989 Landry, Erastus R. - Mrs. Alestine LeBleu 11 December 1883.

When electricity was extended to Rosedale 1926 (?) Ras Landry was one of the landowners granting right to run line on his property.

This letter is in reference to an old black cemetery originally named Lincoln Burial Park established on 10 acres of land about 1930. The location is on LaBelle Road approximately 4900 feet south of intersection Frint and LaBelle (towards the golf course). The present name of the cemetery is called Broussards Cemetery.

Last week I noticed someone had used machinery to clear a path on the burial site. I noticed a head stone was moved and also a lawn crypt. This clearly looks like someone has committed an offense under Section 711.0311 of the Texas Health and Safety Code. Under subsection C, a person commits an offense if the person acts without proper legal authority and knowingly:

- (1) defaces, vandalizes, injures, or removes a gravestone, monument, or other structure commemorating a deceased person or group of persons, whether located within or outside of a cemetery.

According to the opinion I received from the Texas Attorney General's office, the Texas Health and Safety Code grants cities and counties with authority to monitor cemeteries within their respective jurisdictions.

Section 713.009. Local Possession and Control of Unkept or Abandoned Cemetery.

- (a) **A municipality with a cemetery inside the municipality's boundaries may, by resolution, take possession and control of the cemetery on behalf of the public if the cemetery threatens or endangers public health, safety, comfort, and welfare.**

From the previous phone calls I have made to various governmental offices to get this area cleaned up, I'm always given the incorrect information that this cemetery is a private cemetery. **This is incorrect.** As stated by the Beaumont Court of Appeals in 1925, the law contemplates two classes of graveyards; public and private. Private cemeteries are used only by a family or small portion of the community. I can assure you that I have a relative buried at Lincoln Park and it is a public cemetery with no access.

Also, I'd like to thank Michael who is the supervisor on Boyt Road. He and I kept missing each other with our return phone calls. I truly wish to see this burial ground cleaned up and be recognized once again after so many years of being ignored and forgotten.

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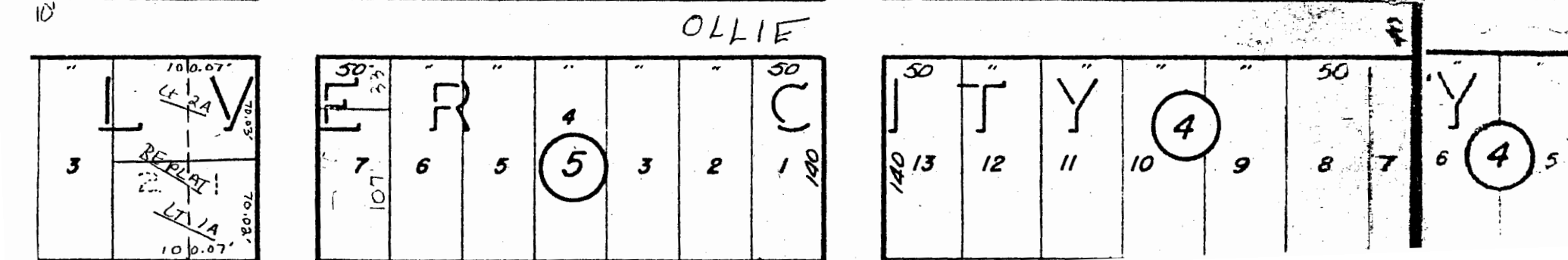
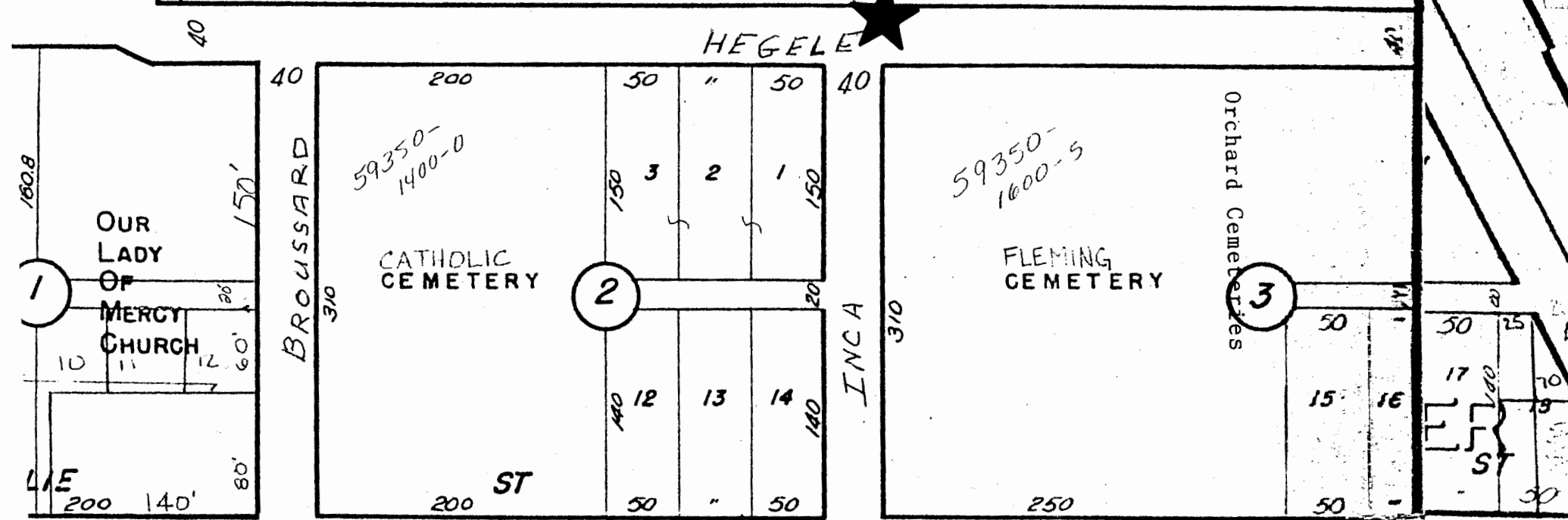
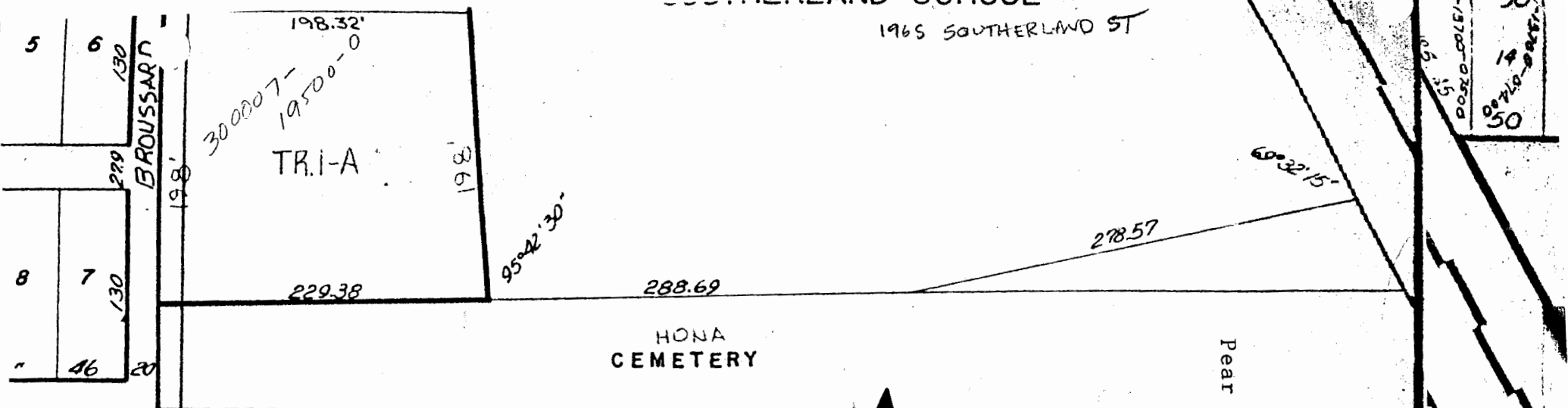
PEAR ORCHARD

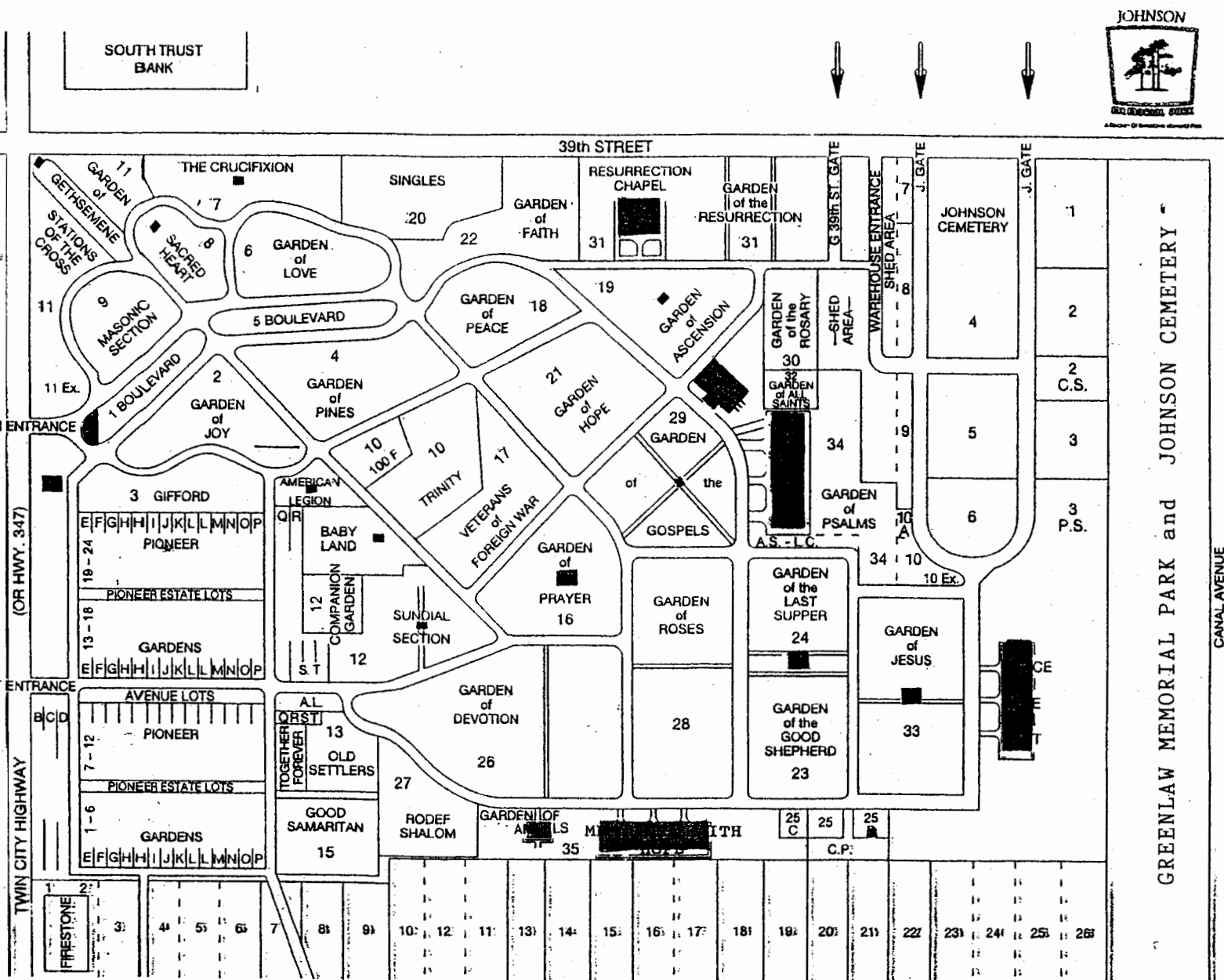
