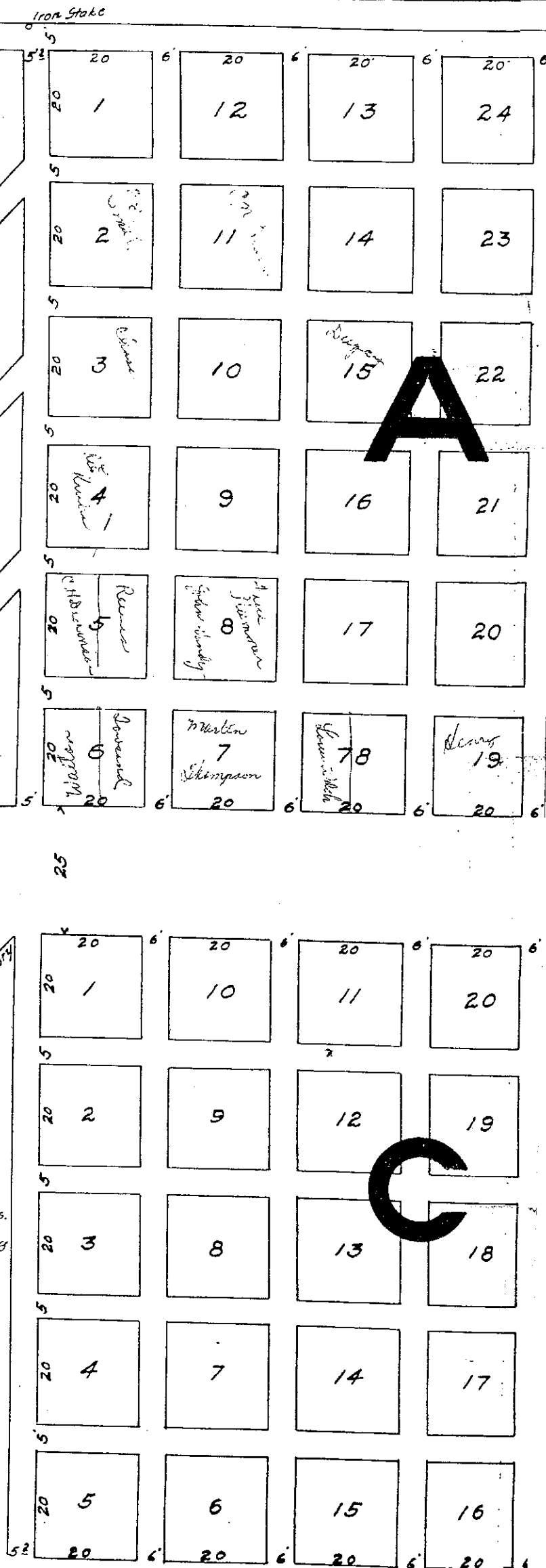
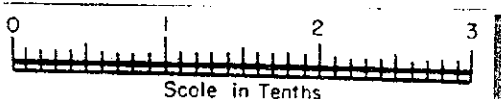

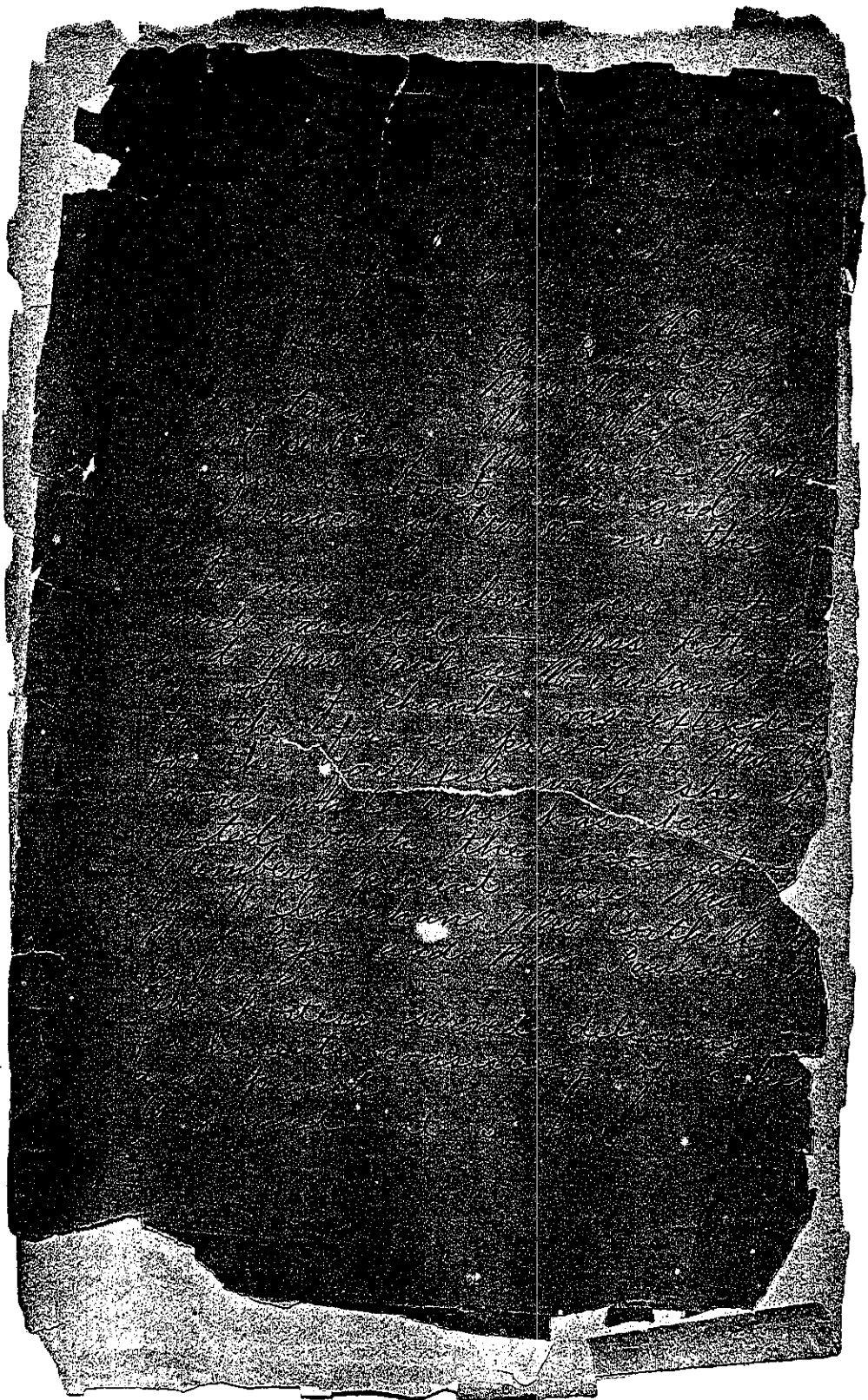

look after the work. Suggested

instruct him about facts that
are bearing, also about marking
off the graves etc. with wood-
blocks put first, to be replaced with
cement posts later.

or relations buried in the cem-
etry, asking them if they will
assist us in repairing damages
done by the storm.
