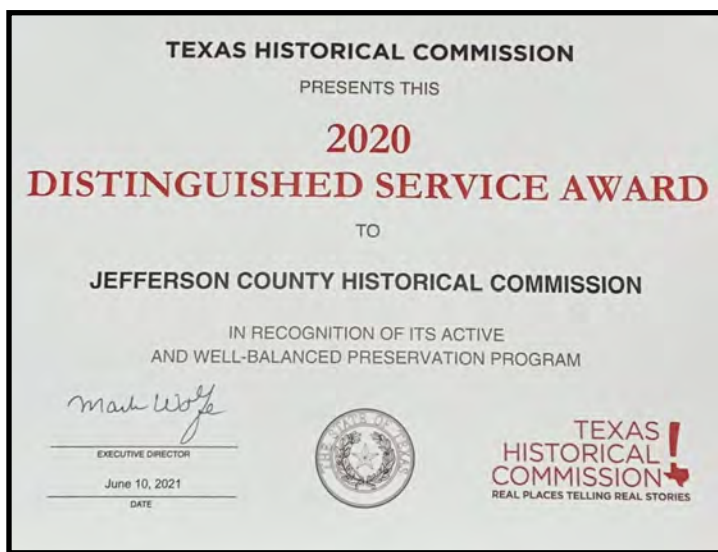
\$15,372

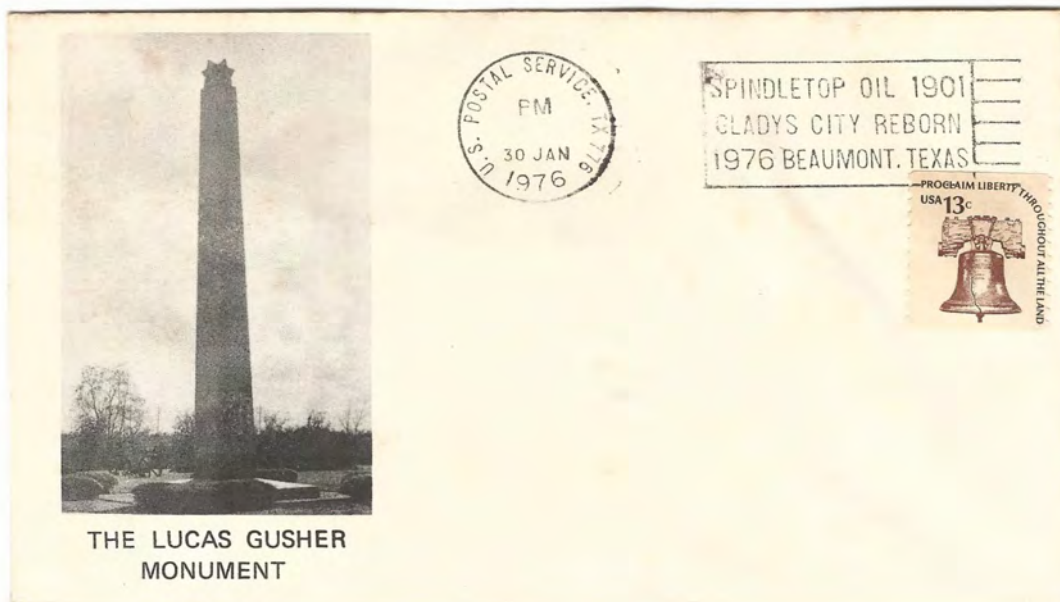

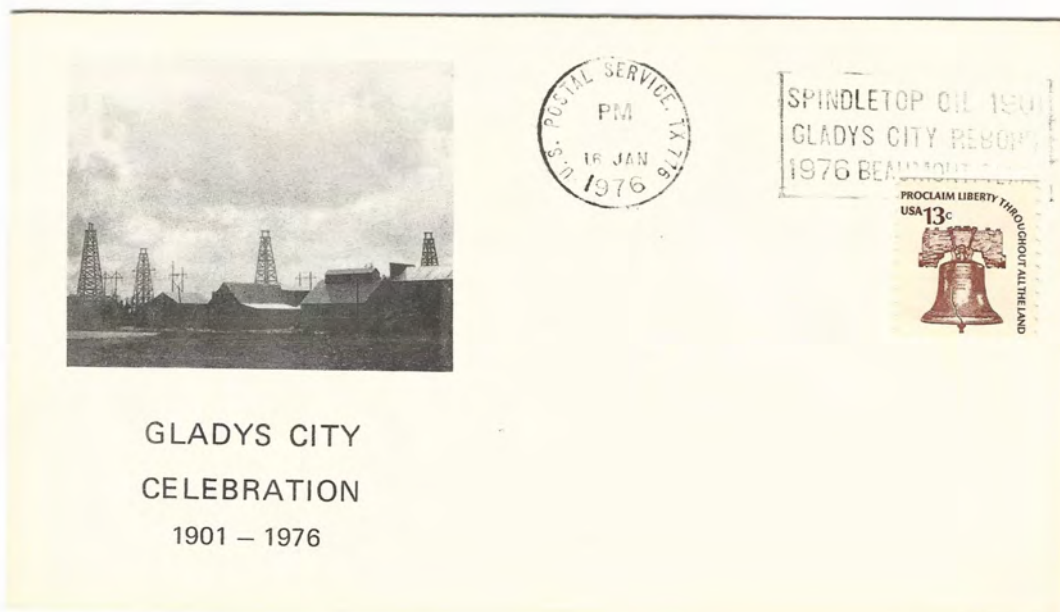

**JCHC MINI-MUSEUM
SPARE BEAUMONT 1977**

The Jefferson County Historical Commission is proud to announce the opening of a new exhibit housed in the Jefferson County Mini-Museum located on the first floor of the Jefferson County Courthouse. The exhibit will be on display through June 15, 2021.

The exhibit, entitled "SPARE Beaumont 1977", consists of 47 photographs and postcards. SPARE is an acronym for Survey and Preservation Analysis of Resources and Environment. "One of the primary purposes of this survey was to recognize and identify distinctive architectural resources within the community and determine their importance suggesting priorities for their preservation."

The exhibit consists of selected then-and-now comparisons of the 1977 survey sites and what, if any, structures exist there today. Dr. Steven P. Lewis, a member of the Jefferson County Historical Commission, visited all 542 of the sites and made a comparison photograph of each. If a postcard exists for a site, a copy of the postcard is included.

There were four SPARE Beaumont Surveys. Lewis has done then-and-now comparisons for the 1977 and 1989 surveys. The number of sites for each year are:

1977.....542

1989.....546

1990.....727

1991.....780

Statistics of SPARE Beaumont 1977:

Number of addresses.....542

Number of addresses demolished.....357

Number of sites intact.....185

Percent of addresses demolished.....65.9%

Percent of addresses intact.....34.1%
