JEFFERSON COUNTY FAST FACTS

\$1 million

Cost to build historic Jefferson County Courthouse dedicated in 1931. Local laborers, defined as Jefferson County residents with a poll tax receipt, were given preference in employment on the construction job.

29

Number of County Clerks who have served in Jefferson County since 1836. The longest tenure, 43 years, was that of Fred Hill who died in office in 1976.

9,000

Number of head of cattle belonging to one of the largest landowners and cattle barons in Jefferson County, Christian Hillebrandt, at the time of his death in 1859.

COURTHOUSE RESTORATION CONTINUES

The Jefferson County Courthouse restoration is continuing with concurrent projects of replacing the entire HVAC system and installing a new fire sprinkler system. The bulk of the work is occurring at this time on the basement and first floors, and work is expected to be completed on these floors by the end of 2015.

GRAND OPENING OF HISTORIC FIRST NATIONAL BANK BUILDING

In March, 2015, the Port Arthur Economic Development Corporation celebrated the grand opening of their offices in the beautifully restored historic First National Bank Building in downtown Port Arthur. The three story building dates to 1930 and now houses the Greater Port Arthur Chamber of Commerce in addition to the Port Arthur EDC.

New market tax credits and the Texas Historical Preservation Tax Credit were used to help finance the \$5.4 million restoration which created 30 construction jobs and 20 permanent jobs.
