# 9/24/2005

Date Hurricane Rita made landfall between Sabine Pass, TX and Holly Beach, LA. The fourth most intense hurricane ever recorded, Rita caused \$12 billion in damages and caused 120 deaths in 4 states.

# 22 Feet

Number of feet of storm surge recorded in Sabine Pass on 9/13/2008 from Hurricane Ike. This was the highest ever recorded storm surge at Sabine Pass and the greatest storm surge ever seen with a Category 2 hurricane.

# 60.58 inches

The top rainfall record in the United States from any tropical cyclone. The record is held by Nederland as a result of rainfall from Hurricane Harvey. In Groves 60.54 inches fell in the same time period.

# JCHC TIDBITS

- Tyrrell Historical Library remains closed at this time for repairs to extensive damage from Hurricane Harvey.
- Two historical markers have been lost at River Front Park in Beaumont due to flooding of the Neches River from Hurricane Harvey. The markers were for *Nancy Tevis* and *Beaumont, Lumber Mill City of the Nineteenth Century.* Thanks to Steven Lewis for alerting JCHC to this loss.
- Due to Hurricane Harvey, the annual October mini-museum exhibit to celebrate Texas Archeology Month has been moved to November 1 December 15, 2017.
- The Jefferson County Historical Commission is proud to announce that State Regional Archeologist Dr. Kerry Nichols will be speaking in Beaumont about the prehistory and archeology of this area, including McFaddin Beach and the recent dune restoration project. The talk will be held on March 8, 2018 at the McFaddin-Ward House Visitor Center. The Jefferson County Historical Commission and the McFaddin-Ward House are co-sponsors of the event.


