Year Joseph Eloi Broussard added rice milling equipment to his grist mill and thus initiated the Texas rice milling industry.

1902

Year the mill town of Voth was established on Pine Island Bayou. It was annexed by the City of Beaumont in 1957.

\$13,810

Amount the 1850 Census Schedule of Manufacturing showed of capital invested in industry, which employed just 25 workers and produced \$28,552 worth of products annually.

Texas Heritage Trails: 50th Anniversary Regional Roundup

The Texas Historical Commission is commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Texas Heritage Trails Program. As part of the celebration, THC is hosting a 10-month-long sweepstakes with prize packages for travel getaways for each of the 10 trail regions.

The <u>Stay an Extra Day Sweepstakes</u> originates from a Texas image marketing survey commissioned by Texas Governor John Connally in the mid-1960's. The survey showed many Americans



In 1997, the Texas Legislature appointed the Texas Historical Commission, one of the original entities on Connally's Texas Travel Trails committee, to develop a heritage tourism program for the state. The THC took the original concept of the trails and expanded them to include the surrounding counties to create a regional statewide heritage tourism program.

Built in 1929 by oilman Miles Frank Yount as a monument to his adopted daughter Mildred, this building is the city's only example of an upper class apartment house to survive from the era after the second Spindletop oil boom. The 18 unit building has no two apartments alike, and was built with modern innovations including cooling and central vacuum. The Mildred Building is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
