### AMENDMENT AS OF March 07, 2024

#### <u>Jefferson County Employee COVID-19 Policy</u>

County employees are highly likely to come in contact with Covid-19 at various points in time. This policy is hereby implemented for all Jefferson County employees, not otherwise excluded as indicated below, who shall abide by this policy:

Excluded from this policy: Law Enforcement Officers and Correctional Institution Personnel (other than clerical staff).

The CDC encourages everyone to receive a COVID-19 vaccination and any vaccine boosters that have been medically proven safe and effective.

# If you begin to experience any of the following symptoms that have been found in people with the COVID-19 virus:

99°F or above Headache Cough Shortness of Breath Loss of Taste or Smell

Diarrhea Fatigue Muscle Aches Sore Throat Nausea/Vomiting Chills

You should be tested and if positive you must quarantine as stated below for "Positive for COVID-19." If negative, continue to self-monitor for symptoms.

<u>At home tests are not an approved test.</u> Approved tests are antigen test/rapid screening test done by Employee Health or a medical provider who is required to provide documentation to the County Health Department. If testing is done by a provider other than Employee Health, proper documentation must be provided to the employee's department head or designated personnel.

#### **Positive for Covid-19**

- o If you test positive for Covid-19 by an approved antigen test/rapid screening test, you must stay at home for at least 3 days and isolate from others. You may end isolation and return to work after day 3 if you are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication and symptoms have improved.
- When you return to work, the CDC recommends you to wear a mask for 5 additional days and limit contact with others.

The Employee Health Clinic (409-784-5881) will help employees of Jefferson County facilitate appointments and/or test for the COVID-19 virus. Please call your primary care physician if additional medication/treatments are needed at any point regarding your COVID-19 health concerns.
