Please see the information below regarding the proposed change order for the removal of the old service panel and installing a new one. This work was suggested by our electrician, Crown Electric, due to the condition of the existing equipment and due to the existing wire only being rated at 400A.

To upgrade the service from the weather-head to the new MSB to 800A we will install two new weather-heads and new conductors in each. We would install a new CT and meter enclosure. We intend to make use of the two existing sleeves through the wall, and would install two new overhead conduits from the sleeves in the wall to the new MSB, while removing and capping off the existing underground conduit. We would have to run our conduit on trapeze overhead, staying as close to the structure as possible.

The total price for this work is \$20,485.00







#### Gentlemen:

In compliance with Section 114.023 of the Local Government Code, I herewith present the monthly report of the financial condition of Jefferson County as of March 31, 2025 together with the results of operations of the budget for the sixth period then ended.

#### Revenue:

Total budgeted revenue collected for the six months ending March 31, 2025 is \$136,035,812. Budgeted Revenues are \$166,038,079 leaving \$30,002,267 in revenue to be collected in order to meet our budgetary revenue goals. Highlights of revenues are as follows:

#### **Property Taxes:**

Property tax collections are \$109,736,666 for the first six months of the year. This amount represents 96% of the budgeted amount of \$114,126,069.

#### Sales Taxes:

Fifty-two percent of budgeted revenue for sales taxes has been collected. Sales Tax revenue is budgeted to be \$32,700,000.

#### Page Two

#### Licenses & Permits:

Forty-two percent of budgeted revenue from Licenses & Permits has been collected. Licenses & Permits are budgeted to be \$383,000 for the year.

#### Intergovernmental:

Thirty percent of Intergovernmental Revenue has been collected. Intergovernmental Revenue is budgeted to be \$1,629,660.

#### Fees:

Forty-five percent of the budgeted revenue for Fees has been collected. Revenue from Fees is budgeted to be \$12,006,110 for the year.

#### Fines and Forfeitures:

Forty-six percent of Fines and Forfeitures have been collected. Revenues from Fines and Forfeitures are budgeted to be \$1,405,000.

#### Interest:

Seventy-four percent of Interest has been collected. Revenues from Interest are budgeted to be \$3,751,250.

#### Other Revenues:

Nothing of Other Revenues have been collected. Revenues from Other Revenues are budgeted to be \$37,000 for the year.

#### **Expenditures:**

Overall for the County's budgeted funds, forty-nine percent of the expenditures have been spent.

#### Page Three

Expenditures are budgeted to be \$176,429,730, which includes General Funds and debt service funds, excluding budgeted transfers of \$7,164,138 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025.





The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) recently issued a new contract to SylogistGov, Inc. to provide victim notification software for Texas' Statewide Automated Victim Notification Service (SAVNS) program. This replaces the previous software used by your county, Texas VINE, operated by Appriss Insights, LLC. The transition to the new vendor will be completed by August 31, 2025.

As we begin this important transition, the OAG asks for your partnership on several key steps ahead. A critical next action is executing the **enclosed Service Agreement** between your entity and SylogistGov, Inc. The agreement mirrors the Service Agreement language signed in previous years by your entity with Appriss Insights, LLC.

Due to the compressed timeline referenced above, we respectfully request expedited review and execution of the Service Agreement by May 16, 2025. Delays beyond this date may affect Sylogist's ability to fully transition victim notification services for your county by the deadline of August 31, 2025—potentially causing service disruptions that we <u>must</u> avoid. It is the top priority of the OAG to ensure a smooth transition and the continuity of victim notifications service operations for your county. We are here to assist in this process in any way that we can.

SylogistGov, Inc. will contact your county directly begin onboarding with your SAVNS program staff, IT points of contact, and your jail management and court management system vendors. The OAG Grants Administration Division has also shared several critical communications in recent weeks outlining these next steps that we encourage you to review.

## PARTICIPATING ENTITIES SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR THE STATEWIDE AUTOMATED VICTIM NOTIFICATION SERVICE (SAVNS)

CONTRACT NUMBER: 52025-SYZ-

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is the Texas State agency tasked with providing a Statewide Automated Victim Notification Service (SAVNS) to a variety of political subdivisions of the State of Texas, including counties, county Sheriffs, Community Supervision Departments, courts, clerks, district attorneys, county attorneys, and others that are participating in the SAVNS ("Participating Entities"). The OAG conducted a competitive solicitation and contracted with SylogistGov, Inc. as the statewide vendor to provide SAVNS to each of the Participating Entities.

This Agreement is entered into by and between the \_\_\_\_\_ ("Named Entity"), and SylogistGov, Inc. ("Contractor"), (collectively, "the Parties").

## 1. Purpose of the Agreement.

This Participating Entities Services Agreement ("Agreement") is issued in order for Contractor to provide all of the SAVNS services to ("Named Entity") as described in the Contract Documents referenced in Section 5 of this Agreement which are fully incorporated herein by reference.

## 2. Contract Term.

This Agreement shall be effective upon execution and the subscription term for the SAVNS solution shall begin on May 1, 2025 when modification and access to the Integrated Victim Services System (IVSS) is initiated. The agreement shall end on August 31, 2026. The Agreement may be renewed for two (2) optional, two (2) year renewal terms, only to the extent the OAG Contract No. C-02213 for SAVNS remains in effect and is renewed. Any such renewals shall be subject to the requirements of this Agreement and all of the Contract Documents referenced in Section 5 of this Agreement. For clarity, all of the terms regarding Termination shall apply to this Agreement as set out in the OAG Contract No. C-02213 for SAVNS referenced in Section 5 of this Agreement and incorporated herein, and the Named Entity/Participating Entity has all of the same requirements, rights, and remedies as the OAG as set out in the Termination sections of that Contract.

## 3. Compensation and Invoicing.

The Parties stipulate and agree that the total amount to be paid to Contractor in consideration of full and satisfactory performance of all Contractor's duties, services, and obligations as set forth in this Agreement shall be billed on a recurring bi-annual basis, in accordance with Form B – SAVNS Pricing, and not to exceed the bi-annual fee per calendar year, in accordance with the Contract Documents referenced in Section 5 of this Agreement which are incorporated herein.

The SAVNS services shall be performed for the bi-annual fee, which will be billed and invoiced in accordance with Form B – SAVNS Pricing and pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Invoices will contain all pertinent information such as this Agreement's contract number, the dates of services rendered, and outages or performance issues, if any, all in accordance with the Contract Documents referenced in Section 5 of this Agreement.

## 4. Appropriated Funds.

Payments are subject to the availability of appropriated funds. Whereas OAG provides grant funds to the Participating Entities as a reimbursement of the bi-annual fees due hereunder, Contractor acknowledges and agrees that payments for Participating Entity Services provided are contingent upon OAG's receipt of funds appropriated by the Texas Legislature.

- d. Contractor's response to SAVNS RFP dated March, 7 2025.

Each of the above-referenced documents, together with all of their attachments and supporting documents, are hereby incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

## 6. Entire Agreement.

The Parties acknowledge that this Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between them with respect to the SAVNS. No other agreements or understandings, whether written or oral, that are not contained in this Agreement and its supporting Contract Documents shall be binding or valid.

#### **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (this "MOU"), dated as of April \_\_\_\_\_, 2025 (the "Effective Date"), records the mutual understanding and intent of Cyclyx International, LLC ("Cyclyx"), a Delaware limited liability company, ExxonMobil Product Solutions Company, a division of Exxon Mobil Corporation ("ExxonMobil"), a New Jersey corporation, and Jefferson County, Texas ("Jefferson County" or "JC"), a Texas home-rule county-to collaborate on the development of a plastics recycling program in Jefferson County, Texas. Cyclyx, ExxonMobil, and JC are sometimes referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

1. <u>Objectives.</u> The Parties agree to work collaboratively toward the development of a plastics recycling program in Jefferson County, Texas, with the primary objective of increasing the volume of residential post-use plastics aggregated for recycling in Jefferson County and helping to establish Jefferson County as a circular hub for both mechanical and advanced recycling ("the Objective"). The Parties will collaborate on agreed-upon initiatives to progress and support the Objective.

## 2. **Steering Team.**

- (a) Each Party will appoint at least one individual to a Steering Team. The Steering Team will endeavor to meet monthly, either by telephone, video conference, or in person, and an agenda will be provided by Cyclyx prior to the scheduled meeting and meeting minutes will be provided after the meeting, indicating, at a minimum, decisions taken by the Steering Team. Initial Steering Team members will be as follows:
  - Jefferson County Jeff R. Branick, Judge or his designated appointee
  - Cyclyx (MoU Lead Facilitator) Robert Dishman, VP Post Consumer Programs
  - Cyclyx Leslie Hushka, Chief Impact Officer
  - Cyclyx Bill Cooper, SVP Corporate Strategy & Development
  - ExxonMobil Chris Blight, Process Dept Head
  - ExxonMobil Matt Gully, P&GA Manager

A Party may change its Steering Team member at any time by providing written notice to the other Parties.

- (b) The Steering Team will provide direction and guidance on the furtherance of the Objective and collectively identify and agree upon the appropriate scope of the initiatives and participating Parties. Once an initiative has been agreed upon, the Steering Team will assign a separate working team consisting of members from the relevant Parties to administer the initiative, including drafting the appropriate documentation as needed. The meeting minutes of the Steering Team meetings will reflect the members of the assigned working teams for each initiative and the working teams will provide updates to the Steering Team as requested.
- 3. <u>Intention of the Parties</u>. Except with respect to Sections 3 through 6, (i) this MOU does not constitute a binding or legally enforceable commitment, contract or offer to contract with respect to any projects, and it imposes no obligations upon nor grants any rights with respect to any proposed

initiatives; and (ii) any rights and obligations of the Parties hereto with respect to an initiative, if any, will be defined separately in writing as agreed by the Parties. Further, the Parties expressly acknowledge and agree that there is no partnership, joint venture, agent/principal, or any other special relationship of any kind, or intent to create one, between or among the Parties or their respective affiliates with respect to any initiatives, and that neither this MOU nor any discussions, conduct or interactions (including but not limited to, the execution of or agreement upon any non-binding term sheets or proposals) between or among them should be interpreted as creating such a relationship or intent, any of which must instead be documented in a separate agreement that is approved by the respective boards or other governing bodies of the Parties.

- 4. <u>Fees and Expenses.</u> Each Party shall bear their own expenses with respect to this MOU and any agreed-upon initiative, including legal fees incurred in connection with the Objectives of this MOU.
- 5. <u>Disclosure.</u> The parties agree that information exchanged pursuant to this MOU shall be kept confidential, unless already made public by a prior disclosure. The Parties further agree that they shall not make, or cause to be made, any press release or public announcement with respect to the Objectives of this MOU (including but not limited to all subsequent collaborative agreements) without the prior written consent of all Parties. To the extent that disclosure of such information is required by applicable law, including the Texas Public Information Disclosure Act, any Court order or other legal process, the Parties agree to notify the others of the information which is required to be disclosed in advance of disclosing the same. Further, should the parties enter subsequent agreements with third-parties or contractors to further the Objectives contemplated herein, the Parties may disclose information to such third-parties or contractors provided they agree to the same, or more restrictive, non-disclosure terms.
- Miscellaneous. All matters (including any contractual or non-contractual obligations) arising from this MOU or connected thereto, shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Texas applicable to contracts made and to be performed therein. Additionally, should the Parties enter in to subsequent collaborative agreements with each other, in furtherance of the Objectives of this MOU, they agree to include in such agreements (a) waiver of trial by jury and (2) an agreement not to object or seek to transfer venue from the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Texas and of the United States, in each case located in Beaumont, Jefferson County. This MOU may not be assigned by operation of law or otherwise without the express written consent of each of the Parties (which consent may be granted or withheld in the sole discretion of Cyclyx, ExxonMobil, and JC. Sections 3 through 6 of this MOU constitute the entire agreement of Cyclyx, ExxonMobil, and JC with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersede all other prior agreements and undertakings, both written and oral, among Cyclyx, ExxonMobil, and JC. There are no oral representations, agreements, or understandings with respect to the subject matter in this MOU, except as fully stated therein, and this MOU and its execution have not been induced by any representations, agreements, or understandings of any kind other than those stated in this MOU. This MOU may be executed and delivered (including by facsimile transmission, portable data format (.pdf) or other electronic image) in one or more counterparts, and by the different parties hereto in separate counterparts, each of which when executed shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same agreement.







## SECTION 5.9 Dress and Personal Appearance

Employees are expected to maintain an appropriate appearance that is businesslike, neat and clean as determined by the requirements of the area in which the employee works. Because of the various type positions at the County, Department Heads/Elected Officials may set dress code standards appropriate for their area(s) of responsibility.

Dress, appearance, and hygiene should not be offensive or distracting to the public or other employees.

Appropriate appearance includes:

- Apparel- generally, employees should wear appropriate, clean, pressed business attire:
- Hair should be clean, combed, and neatly trimmed or arranged;
- Personal Hygiene good personal hygiene habits must be maintained.

If in the opinion of the supervisor, an employee is not dressed appropriately, the following steps should be taken:

- 1. As deemed appropriate, employees may be sent home to change immediately as well as given a written warning. Pay for the day that the employee is sent home begins when the employee returns to work.
- 2. Further violations could result in dismissal.

If uniforms are the dress attire required in a department, then all employees must comply with uniform guidelines.

## UNIFORM GUIDELINES

The purpose of this policy shall be to maximize safe working conditions, reflect good appearance and to provide ease of recognition, and/or identification of designated employees by the public.

Elected Officials and Department Heads may set guidelines for the issuance and wear of uniforms as needed in their respective offices or department. Employees must follow the specific uniform guidelines of their office/department.

Elected Officials and Department Heads may approve the use of certain clothing items that bear the County seal and name of the office or department, which employees may purchase and wear at their option. Because the clothing bears the County seal, it should be well-maintained, and employees should be mindful of the way they represent the County while wearing such clothing in public.

Uniforms may be purchased by Elected Officials/Department Heads if applicable Budgeted County funds are available by following budget and purchasing guidelines. Uniforms are the property of the County, not the individual employee, and shall be returned to the County upon separation of employment. The following positions and/or job duties have been approved due to nature of the work perform and/or necessity for identification:

Law Enforcement as stipulated in the corresponding union contracts/ Firefighters & Nurses

Crime Lab staff responding to crime scenes

Road Crew/Mechanics/Maintenance positions

Mosquito Control pesticide & herbicide positions

Judicial – robes & rain gear for JPs responding to inquests

Any position that an Elected official/Department head determines to be similarly situated to the above will provide information to the County Auditor and Human Resources stating as such for record keeping purposes.

This policy is necessary to help determine whether all or any part of the uniform expenditures will be considered a taxable fringe benefit to the employee.

Uniforms are excluded from the wages of an employee if they are:

- Specifically required as a condition of employment, and
- Are not worn or adaptable to general usage as ordinary clothing.

Any uniforms determined to not meet the guidelines as exempt, such as blue jeans, as required by the Internal Revenue Services, will be required to be considered taxable wages and the value will be included and corresponding FICA, Medicare, & Federal taxes will be withheld from the employee's paycheck.
