1 JUDGE WEST: All right. I'll call the
2 meeting to order. Gosh, no anybody wants to sit at the

11 those in favor?

12 (ALL RESPONDED.)

13 JUDGE WEST: Any opposed? All right. That
14 passes.

12:32PM 15 Everyone should have a report from the
16 D.A.'s office. Do we have that?

17 UNKNOWN FEMALE VOICE: We don't have those.

18 JUDGE WEST: I'm sorry?

19 UNKNOWN FEMALE VOICE: We're not doing the
12:33PM 20 reports yet still.

21 JUDGE WEST: We're going to skip that for
22 now. Any applications for bondsmen? Renewals?

23 MS. HOLMES: No, ma'am.

24 JUDGE WEST: Okay. Any complaints?

12:33PM 25 MS. HOLMES: No, ma'am.

1 JUDGE WEST: Report from the treasurer's
2 office.

3 MR. FUNCHESS: It's been distributed.

4 JUDGE WEST: Anybody have any questions of
5 the treasurer on that?

6 JUDGE JONES: I move to approve it.

7 JUDGE WEST: I don't think we have to
8 approve it. It's just for everybody's -- that one.

9 Thank you, though. Anything you need to point out?

10 JUDGE LIVELY: I second what we don't have
11 to do.

12 JUDGE WEST: Okay. Anything you need to
13 point out to us?

14 MR. FUNCHESS: All good.

15 JUDGE WEST: Perfect. Any requests for
16 release of property?

17 MS. SEGURA: No.

18 | JUDGE WEST: Okay.

19 MR. REED: Yes. I made a request for a
20 release.

21 | JUDGE WEST: When?

22 MS. SEGURA: When?

23 MS. BRODE: That was last meeting.

24 MR. REED: No. For this meeting.

25 JUDGE WEST: When did you?

1 MR. REED: Once.

2 JUDGE WEST: Who did you --

3 MR. REED: Becky was out.

4 JUDGE WEST: When did you send it?

12:34PM 5 MR. REED: Pardon?

6 JUDGE WEST: When did you send it?

7 MR. REED: About a month ago.

8 MS. SEGURA: I didn't get anything. I can
9 check on it.

12:34PM 10 JUDGE WEST: Okay. So what we'll do is
11 check on that. And if -- Becky is out sick.

12 MR. REED: Okay.

13 JUDGE WEST: And so it didn't get to us but
14 if it's all -- if everything is going to be okay, we'll
15 get her to send an E-mail out. And I can send out an
16 E-mail to everyone, and we'll do it by E-mail vote.

17 | MR. REED: Okay.

18 JUDGE WEST: Auditor's officers report.

19 MS. BRODE: It's been distributed. We
12:34PM 20 don't have a lot of revenue because we're not collecting
21 the bail bond fees.

22 JUDGE WEST: I'm going to talk about that
23 in a minute

24 MS. BRODE: Okay. And I would like to
12:34PM 25 introduce Letisia Johnson who is going to be my back-

1 coming to meetings. She's a lot quieter than me, so
2 y'all should like her more.

3 JUDGE WEST: Hi, Letisia. Thank you for
4 being here.

12:35PM 5 JUDGE JONES: I move we accept Letisia.

6 JUDGE WEST: All right. The next thing on
7 the agenda is to discuss extending that grace period on
8 the bondmen's liability issue. We had -- we've been
9 doing this kind of meeting by meeting. I think we're
12:35PM 10 still unfortunately in a position where we need to do
11 that until the next meeting. And then I met with Mary
12 yesterday for quite some time just about a couple of
13 things that I'm going to talk about today and that we
14 probably can put on the agenda for next month to maybe
12:35PM 15 actually start addressing some of these things and
16 getting them taken care even if it's just a little bit
17 at a time.

18 So as far as extending it, we obviously
19 need to do that. They're not where they need to be.
12:35PM 20 Everyone is trying to get where they need to be. But
21 we've got a lot of moving parts that are going into that
22 and so -- yes, ma'am.

23 MS. BRODE: I have a question.

24 JUDGE WEST: Yes.

12:36PM 25 MS. BRODE: I know that we have at least

1 one bail bond company that's working with MIS to get
2 their list cleared up.

3 JUDGE WEST: I'm about to talk about all
4 that.

12:36PM 5 MS. BRODE: Okay. I needed to know who
6 else was being active.

7 JUDGE WEST: I'm about to get to all of
8 that.

9 MS. BRODE: Thank you.

12:36PM 10 JUDGE WEST: So -- but before we move onto
11 that we need to talk -- we need to approve, I think,
12 just one more month at least on that. We'll need a
13 motion and a vote to be able --

14 JUDGE JONES: So moved.

12:36PM 15 JUDGE LIVELY: Second.

16 JUDGE WEST: All right. We have a motion.
17 And so the motion would be to extend the -- how did we
18 word --

19 JUDGE WOODS: Grace period.

12:36PM 20 JUDGE WEST: -- the grace period for the
21 liability issues for not 30 days but until the next
22 meeting. So whatever that meeting date is we'll need to
23 put that in there for next month.

24 MS. SEGURA: September 20th.

12:36PM 25 JUDGE WEST: Is that our next one?

1 MS. SEGURA: Yes.

2 JUDGE WEST: Yes, ma'am. That sounds fine.

3 And then motion by Judge Jones; second by Judge Lively.

4 Any other discussion about that? All those in favor?

12:37PM 5 (ALL RESPONDED.)

6 JUDGE WEST: Any opposed?

7 MS. SEGURA: 21st.

8 JUDGE WEST: That will be September 21st.

9 MS. SEGURA: Yeah.

12:37PM 10 JUDGE WEST: All right. So that passes.

11 We had added -- or it was added to consider or discuss a
12 personal bond form in format. My understanding was
13 Judge Derouen was going to be here.

14 MS. HOLMES: I spoke with Becky. And
12:37PM 15 because she was out ill and said that she wouldn't have
16 the form ready that Judge Derouen would be here to talk
17 about it.

18 MS. SEGURA: That was my understanding,
19 also.

12:37PM 20 JUDGE WEST: So I guess two things.

21 JUDGE WOODS: I have it right here in my
22 hands.

23 JUDGE WEST: Yeah. I think we want --
24 unless you're ready to discuss it --

12:37PM 25 JUDGE WOODS: No.

1 JUDGE WEST: I think we need Judge Derouen.

2 JUDGE WOODS: Yeah. Because he does most
3 all of the arraignment.

4 JUDGE WEST: So apparently there is some

6 recognizant bond, which I never knew. Judge Woods

7 didn't know. And so the way we're wording things

8 sometimes in court is not exactly maybe what we're

1 to figure out.

2 The billing -- so we're trying to figure
3 out even -- just a temporary solution to get bondsmen to
4 start paying those fees that need to be paid. They're
12:39PM 5 going to be owed. All that's going to do is add up for
6 you guys. So the sooner we can get it where that can
7 happen the better. So there is three different things
8 that we talked about that they're working on with
9 everyone, with Becky, with county clerk, and jail. One
12:39PM 10 is that billing. Two is getting those daily reports for
11 you guys, and then making sure the liability is current
12 and proper. So that's one thing -- those three things
13 kind of we need to talk about.

14 Everyone, all the bondsmen were given a
12:39PM 15 report some time ago. And I don't know for sure, but I
16 know mainly Tamara with Keith has been working very hard
17 and very diligently on behalf of kind of all of you guys
18 to help get this stuff done. But from us to the
19 bondsmen, we need you-all to look at those reports and
12:40PM 20 get with Becky or Rhonda or somebody because if they're
21 not right, it's up to you to help us figure that out.
22 And so we can't do it. Everybody is overloaded here.
23 Becky is overloaded in a huge way. MIS is overloaded
24 doing things that really isn't their job, trying to help
12:40PM 25 everybody else do their job. But we can't do it if you

1 guys don't go through and get with them and go through
2 those report and let us know what the issues are on
3 those reports. They're closer and closer. They have
4 now gotten where they're sending Tamara -- you know, a
12:41PM 5 report so that she can see if she's finding things that
6 are wrong so that when we start it full blown for
7 everybody, hopefully all those issues will be taken care
8 of. A temporary solution on the billing part -- so
9 that's the report part. Temporary solution on the
12:41PM 10 billing is to get all of the bondsmen a report from --
11 start with month by month, get you March. And you go
12 through and -- we're going to make it where it can be
13 paid at the county clerk. So you can come to the
14 courthouse, pay the clerk's office. Eventually, it will
12:41PM 15 be different. But for now, we're going to try to do
16 month by month and get everybody caught up. This is
17 going to be a lot of -- you guys just going through and
18 being as thorough as you can, obviously, as honest as
19 you can on what you owe. And they're going to set it up
12:41PM 20 in the clerk's office, so they can have a tab or
21 whatever you call it so that it goes to the right place
22 for the right thing. Because we're going to owe -- I
23 mean, 90 percent of that goes to the state. So we've
24 got to start doing that as well. I think that is
12:42PM 25 something that we would have to vote on, though. And

1 it's not on the agenda. So what I'm going to ask is to
2 have it placed on the agenda for next month and between
3 now and then and ask all of you to really start going --
4 if you have not already, what you were provided by -- I
12:42PM 5 guess, you and Rhonda and Becky are working together on
6 all of that, look at what you've got. If you don't have
7 it, call them and say, "What do y'all need me to be
8 looking at?"

9 MS. BRODE: May I interject?

12:42PM 10 JUDGE WEST: Yes, please.

11 MS. BRODE: The reason we're going to clean
12 it up -- and Tamara can -- if she wants to speak on
13 it --

14 MS. RITENOUR: That's fine.

12:42PM 15 MS. BRODE: Feel free to say. How many
16 thousands of dollars have you gotten cleared up off --

17 MS. RITENOUR: Close to 3 million 300.

18 MS. BRODE: 3 million. So if the bonding
19 companies don't take the initiative to clean up their
12:42PM 20 list when we stop giving this --

21 JUDGE WEST: Grace period.

22 MS. BRODE: -- grace period, they'll have
23 to give more collateral. There will be no more grace.
24 We need the bonding companies to own this, to help us.

12:43PM 25 MS. RITENOUR: Well, I have -- are y'all

1 getting a daily report at all? Are you -- y'all got the
2 original one?

3 JUDGE WEST: They just got the original --
4 so they're not sending -- she told me yesterday that
12:43PM 5 she's just working with you on that --

6 MS. RITENOUR: Right.

7 JUDGE WEST: -- because you -- immediately
8 when you got your original --

9 MS. RITENOUR: Yeah.

12:43PM 10 JUDGE WEST: -- stepped up and worked with
11 her.

12 MS. RITENOUR: Right.

13 JUDGE WEST: And so if you need something
14 more recent -- I mean, call and ask for it and do it. I
12:43PM 15 mean, everybody we've -- Odyssey has been an issue but
16 it's -- we're -- however many months down the line and
17 we're having to figure it out, it's done. We've got to
18 do it. It can't just now be, well, Odyssey sucks and
19 so. We're not going -- you know, I mean, it might right
12:43PM 20 now still. I mean, hopefully, it's going to get better
21 still. We're learning it. And they're fixings things,
22 and everybody is learning how to use it properly. But
23 we can't help you guys much longer if you're not going
24 to step up and do that and take care of your stuff, too.
12:44PM 25 So that's where we are on that, so...

1 MS. RITENOUR: I have a suggestion, for the
2 bonding companies, if y'all will send Mary an E-mail --
3 or I can. I mean, it doesn't matter. There is going to
4 be -- right now there is going to be an accusation
12:44PM 5 docket, and then there is going to be, like, a full
6 court docket. There is two different liabilities on
7 both. Because again, they can't attach them together.
8 I would ask for the most recent. And then that way
9 y'all can all see what I've done as far as how the
12:44PM 10 docket is going to look. And then what's going to
11 happen is when you have an accusation that was picked
12 up, it's going to come directly off of that and then be
13 added over here. The one report that I finished this
14 week was the accusation report, and there was a lot of
12:44PM 15 people that still had case numbers and they were -- it
16 was duplicating. And so it was taking liability off
17 both, I would probably ask them for the most recent.
18 Start there, go down, because -- they're right when
19 that's 30 days out -- however y'all -- I'm pretty sure
12:45PM 20 everybody will be putting their -- in default or close.
21 Not me, because I've been working on them both. Make
22 sure they're on both. Make sure they're not on the
23 same. And then so -- I can have her send it -- I can
24 have Alex send to all of y'all today or tomorrow.
12:45PM 25 That's where I would start.

1 JUDGE WEST: Seriously thank you so much.

2 MS. BRODE: Thank you. Yes.

3 MS. RITENOUR: You're welcome.

4 JUDGE WEST: Everybody owes Tamara a lot

12:45PM 5 because she has worked -- done way more and above and
6 beyond to help make this happen for the bondsmen and
7 working with Becky and Rhonda and MIS so.

8 MS. BRODE: The county is very
9 appreciative.

12:45PM 10 MS. RITENOUR: I appreciate it.

11 JUDGE WEST: And so time for everybody to
12 do -- to step up also.

13 MS. SEGURA: You said number ten. What do
14 you want on number ten?

12:45PM 15 JUDGE WEST: That's the -- to consider
16 getting the bondsmen to start paying back from -- to
17 approve a temporary solution --

18 MS. SEGURA: Okay.

19 JUDGE WEST: -- for bondsmen paying their
12:46PM 20 fees, starting with the month of March and to pay the
21 county clerk's office. Hopefully, that will be set up
22 by then and we can get that approved and they can start
23 doing it next month.

24 So the other thing that has come up is
12:46PM 25 municipal liability for bonds. So right now when you

1 guys -- you guys meaning bondsmen -- make a bond on a
2 municipal court bond, it has never gone on your
3 liability. And the problem or -- that has come up is
4 Odyssey does not distinguish. So if you make a bond,
12:46PM 5 it's a bond. We brainstormed a little bit yesterday.
6 And I'm going to ask our legal counsel between now and
7 next -- you and Roebuck maybe to help us out, Dustin,
8 because the easiest thing to do would be for it to
9 remain the way it is. And those municipal court bonds
12:47PM 10 not go on your liability. I don't know legally if
11 it's -- it should have been going on the whole time and
12 it didn't, if we can just do that and it's fine. But if
13 we -- I seem to -- I'm not even really sure if it's a
14 decision that we make, you know. But it's something has
12:47PM 15 to happen. Because pretty soon it's going to all show
16 up and y'all are going to have -- and I know it's
17 probably not going to be substantial amount. But it's
18 still going to be something, and it's going to show up.
19 Now, there is a way in Odyssey for them to -- they can
12:47PM 20 categorize it, call it something different, and it will
21 not go on your liability the way -- just it always has
22 been. I'm okay with that. We could discuss that at the
23 next meeting. I want everybody to think about it. But
24 I don't want us to vote on something that we shouldn't
12:48PM 25 legally be doing. And so we need to find out first if

1 you're supposed to have that come off your liability.
2 If you are, then it's easy. It's the way it is. But
3 it's going to be a pain, big time for our system.
4 Because that money, it's just different. It goes to the
12:48PM 5 municipalities, and they're holding their prisoners and
6 it's just a whole thing. If we can keep it the way it
7 is, it would be great for, I think, for everybody.

8 MR. REED: Absolutely.

9 MS. BRODE: Auditing was concerned. Mary
12:48PM 10 brought this to us first. So I talked to Judge Lively.
11 There were two situations, one JP courts were getting
12 added. That absolutely needs to remain.

13 JUDGE WEST: Yes.

14 MS. BRODE: That's Jefferson County. That
12:48PM 15 needs to remain. And then it was one of those -- with
16 the municipalities, well, they're staying in Jefferson
17 County's jail but they're going to the municipality's
18 court. We've discussed it. And auditing's view is
19 we're good not having that anywhere on our books.

12:49PM 20 JUDGE WEST: I know. I think everybody
21 agrees that --

22 MS. BRODE: We don't want it on our books.

23 JUDGE WEST: It will be a nightmare, so...

24 MS. BRODE: Let's leave it.

12:49PM 25 JUDGE WEST: If we can find a way to get

1 around that and say as a board, I guess, if we need
2 to -- because Mary said -- Mary Helm -- said you know,
3 she could make it happen. But it's not her decision to
4 go into the system and make that happen. Somebody needs
12:49PM 5 to tell her that it's okay to make this distinction and
6 not add it to the liability. And I think we're the
7 only, I guess, governing board that could do that. So
8 if that makes sense.

9 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: My question would be, if
12:49PM 10 they had the city jail would we be tracking the
11 liabilities?

12 JUDGE WEST: We wouldn't be.

13 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Because basically the
14 contract with the cities for the jail is we're an
12:49PM 15 extension of their jail, strictly for them.

16 JUDGE LIVELY: Yeah. We're a tenant there.

17 JUDGE WEST: Right.

18 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Yeah. So...

19 JUDGE WEST: So maybe that helps us legally
12:50PM 20 to make that decision.

21 JUDGE LIVELY: Also -- I mean, there is no
22 communication between municipality and the county as to
23 whether that bond has been satisfied or not.

24 JUDGE WEST: Right.

12:50PM 25 JUDGE LIVELY: No way you know the

1 liability -- what's done with that liability, so...

2 JUDGE WEST: I think it makes sense. And I
3 think it's probably the good way to do it. I think we
4 just need to maybe vote on that, so that someone is
12:50PM 5 making that decision and telling MIS to make that
6 distinction. And so let's put that on the agenda.

7 We'll do -- everybody think about it. If you want to
8 research it and talk about it some more, but we can vote
9 on that next -- next meeting. There was something else
12:50PM 10 you told me y'all were talking about. I didn't -- did I
11 write it down?

12 There is a report that has been requested
13 or that used to be you guys as bondsmen could get from
14 the jail and -- go ahead.

12:51PM 15 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: So the inmate release
16 report shows the person that was released and how they
17 were released, either bond or -- we used to print the
18 report, let the bondsmen see it and releases, then they
19 would give it back and then go on. So the request is is
12:51PM 20 through Odyssey to send that report digitally through
21 E-mail to all the bondsmen. The question is is that a
22 record we can send and what's the purpose that record
23 serves y'all?

24 JUDGE WEST: Like, what do you guys get out
12:51PM 25 of that report? Is there something that's necessary on

1 that that you need? Because if not, it's not something
2 that needs to be going out.

3 MS. RITENOUR: Well, it's -- we discussed
4 it -- it's probably the best way. I talked to Mary and
12:51PM 5 Alex and that would be the best way for them to send us
6 a report if they did it weekly, and then we can go ahead
7 and start assessing what is our bond assessments, what's
8 correct and what's not correct. The other thing is
9 they -- on our docket that we used to have we were able
12:52PM 10 to see when our clients were re-arrested, on whether a
11 forfeiture -- it automatically popped up on our docket
12 the next day. The new program does not do that for us.
13 So this would be able to let us know at-large were
14 arrested, if someone we're looking for -- you know,
12:52PM 15 posted a bond with somebody else. And then the other
16 reason is because we keep track of what everybody is
17 doing, as well. So I pay attention what Al Reed is
18 writing, what Allied is writing, who they wrote. If we
19 have the same person because -- a lot times we have the
12:52PM 20 same people on bond. We don't know until we see that
21 list. So Tiffany would go in, she would write it out,
22 Patsy go, Lisa goes. And so it's not just to be nosy,
23 there is actual -- we've been doing -- I've been here
24 18 years. So it's been very difficult to not have it
12:52PM 25 for the last few months.

1 JUDGE WEST: I think it's a jail decision
2 to make. We just wanted to bring it up to see --

3 MS. RITENOUR: Yeah.

4 JUDGE WEST: -- as far as --

12:52PM 5 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: The sheriff and the
6 jail, it's not going to create any additional work for
7 us. It's a programming thing where Mary --

8 JUDGE WEST: We could do it. We just
9 wanted to make sure what -- kind of what the reason was
12:53PM 10 and if it really needed to be done.

11 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: We just want to make
12 sure we're not releasing any information outside of the
13 criminal justice system that doesn't need to be
14 released.

12:53PM 15 MS. RITENOUR: I'm sorry.

16 MS. BRODE: That was report -- what's on
17 that report say?

18 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: It's got their inmate's
19 ID, their name, date of birth, height, weight, the date
12:53PM 20 they were released, who they were released to.

21 MS. FOURNIER: Is this the same report that
22 was used for the county clerk's office to collect the
23 bonding fee? Because we'll need some type of report --

24 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: No. That would be -- we
12:53PM 25 would do that through probably the financial side on

1 that.

2 JUDGE WEST: This is just the jail saying
3 who was released each day.

12:53PM

4 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Jail roster, who we
5 released each day.

6 MR. REED: I mean, the 36 years that's been
7 published information.

12:54PM

8 JUDGE WEST: Well, just because we've
9 always done that way doesn't mean it's right. That's
10 why --

11 MR. REED: I know it's not the public
12 information.

12:54PM

13 JUDGE WEST: That's why I was bringing it
14 up is to make sure that there isn't anything on there
15 that we shouldn't have been doing in the past.

16 That's --

17 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Information --

18 JUDGE WEST: -- reevaluate.

12:54PM

19 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Identifying information,
20 just like Judge Lively said, is the issue whenever you
21 talk about public information, which is dates of birth,
22 identification number, those types of thing. The only
23 thing I see on here that could be an issue is their date
24 of birth with their name. That may cause an issue for
25 you, if you had two people with the same name and can't

1 distinguish by date of birth. That's under the public
2 information so...

3 MS. BRODE: Well, could that be as easy as
4 writing the ECR, taking the -- the date of birth.

12:54PM 5 MS. RITENOUR: Yes, ma'am. Mary said
6 something that -- we're not supposed to see. But the
7 date of birth is pretty important for the bonding
8 company.

9 MS. FOURNIER: So most statutes report that
12:54PM 10 dates of births are not public record. The county clerk
11 office has to redact every date of birth that comes from
12 through our -- even our criminal misdemeanor cases, we
13 have to redact the date of birth.

14 MS. RITENOUR: They can take --

12:55PM 15 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Age isn't on the report.
16 We can take the date of birth out.

17 MS. RITENOUR: Right.

18 JUDGE WEST: I would just say -- my
19 suggestion would just be to double check, maybe get with
12:55PM 20 Cathleen and see what really -- make sure that whatever
21 is on there is something that could be released if it
22 was a public information request. And if it's not, then
23 that needs to be -- to come out of the report. And then
24 y'all can -- I mean, it's up to y'all to do the report.
12:55PM 25 It's not a decision for us. But we wanted to talk about

1 it. Make sure it's been being done right.

2 MS. BRODE: Only releases?

3 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Only releases.

4 MS. BRODE: Does it give the bond company

6 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Uh-huh. Yeah. I mean,
7 I'll give you -- this is an example. But it actually
8 gives -- like, one of these cases a guy was re-arrested
9 on a charge. So it shows the first time he made the

12:56PM 10 bond and the bonding company, but it doesn't show
11 multiple arrests. So it will show, like, Allied bonded
12 this guy on the original charge; and then he was
13 re-arrested with another charge. Then Bail America made
14 the bond on it. So y'all have to kind of go through and
12:56PM 15 make sure if Allied still has a bond on it or not, you
16 know.

17 JUDGE WEST: I mean, I can understand why
18 it would be helpful for y'all. Just want to make
19 sure -- and they want to make sure nothing is being
12:56PM 20 given out that, number one, that is useful and not just
21 because you want -- and that it's legal, so...

22 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: The biggest part is the
23 legal. We don't want to -- when we're controlling it
24 and you're looking at it at the window and we're not
12:56PM 25 letting you leave with it, it's one thing. But when

1 we're actually sending it out, you know, publically then
2 that's a little different story.

3 JUDGE WEST: Yeah.

4 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: And the statutes are
12:56PM 5 pretty -- you know, solid on what's identified
6 information.

7 MS. FOURNIER: Yeah. The Public
8 Information Act says that all living person's Social
9 Security numbers and date of births are not public
12:57PM 10 records.

11 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Right. Driver's
12 license.

13 MS. FOURNIER: And driver -- yeah.

14 MR. GALMOR: The age must be okay because
12:57PM 15 the sheriff's department has everyone's age that's in
16 custody listed on the --

17 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: Yeah. Age is okay.
18 It's just the actual birth.

19 JUDGE WEST: The actual date of birth. And
12:57PM 20 maybe -- I don't know if y'all have that information if
21 adding age would be helpful if they can --

22 CHIEF SHAUBERGER: I can get with Mary and
23 see if she can --

24 JUDGE WEST: Tweak that report to where you
12:57PM 25 can -- at least it will give you an idea if you have

1 got, you know, the father or son or that kind of stuff.
2 So that's kind of it as far as the other things that --
3 to discuss. Anybody else have anything that we need to
4 discuss that's not on the agenda to bring up? All
12:57PM 5 right. So again just, thank you, Tamara, again.
6 Everybody please get with her to see what she's been
7 doing, so that y'all can all start getting through that
8 process because starting probably next month, we'll get
9 some way to start those fees being paid and get closer
12:58PM 10 and closer to getting it all done. All right. Is there
11 a motion to adjourn?
12 JUDGE WOODS: Motion.
13 JUDGE LIVELY: Second.
14 JUDGE WEST: All right. We're adjourned.
