1 JUDGE WEST: All right. I'm going to call the  
2 meeting to order. The first is to review the minutes. Those  
3 were emailed -- from last month's meeting. Those were emailed  
4 out yesterday, I think, for everybody to take a look at, if  
5 anybody has any questions about those. If not, we need to vote  
6 on approving those.

7 MR. FUNCHESS: I move to approve.

22 JUDGE WEST: -- being accidentally checked off  
23 because it has the level of the offense first instead of the  
24 bondsman's names.

25 CAPTAIN MORRIS: Yes, ma'am.

1 JUDGE WEST: Okay. Perfect. Any other  
2 discussion on that? Okay. That's good.

3 The last thing has -- on my agenda has to do with  
4 the financial statement and the cash flow part being on that  
5 financial statement. Keith Day had brought that up. I did a  
6 little bit of looking into it. I didn't do as much as I needed  
7 to. I need to talking to Tim about that. But Keith's not here  
8 today and asked if we would table that until the next meeting,  
9 and then I can get with Tim in the meantime to talk a little bit  
10 more about if that is really required to have or not. And, so,  
11 we'll put that back on the agenda for next meeting. That is all  
12 I have on the agenda.

21 because they said it was the rule or the policy. Do y'all know  
22 anything about that being some kind of actual rule?
