STANDARD BOND CONDITIONS IN COUNTY COURT AT LAW NO.1, 2 & 3

Following the return of a criminal information in County Court at Law No. 1, 2 & 3 of Jefferson County, Texas, all bail bonds executed for release of any defendant named therein are ordered subject to the following additional conditions:


1. The defendant shall commit no offense against the laws of this State, any other State, or of the United States;
2. The defendant shall submit to testing for drugs and alcohol at any time as directed by the Court; **the Court may revoke the bond and order the arrest of any defendant who: (a) refuses to submit to a test for drugs and alcohol when directed to do so by the court; or, (b) submits to a test for drugs and alcohol and the test indicates the presence of drugs or alcohol in the defendant's body.** Texas Code of Criminal Procedure Article 17.44(a)(2), (c)(2)


3. The defendant shall not communicate, either directly or indirectly, with the alleged victim of the pending offense, and the defendant shall not go near any residence, school, or other location frequented by the alleged victim; and,
4. A defendant whose information charges any subsequent offense listed under Sections 49.04 – 49.06 of the Texas Penal Code shall not operate any motor vehicle unless the vehicle is equipped with an interlock device mechanism that makes impractical the operation of the vehicle if ethyl alcohol is detected in the breath of the operator; and said device shall be installed at the defendant's expense with **written verification of such installation being submitted to the Court on or before the date scheduled for the defendant's initial appearance.**
