JEFFERSON COUNTY FAST FACTS

1914

Year Florence Stratton started the Milk and Ice Fund to help provide poor families during the summer months with needed milk and ice.

1/9/1934

Date of accidental death of Mrs. Fred B. Hills at the Jefferson County Courthouse after suffering a fall down the elevator shaft from the eighth floor. Her husband filed a claim for \$26,000 in damages.

April, 1909

Month the Women's Club of Beaumont clubhouse was completed, and the first event held was a banquet in the auditorium for the Oil Producer's Association.

FLOYD FRANK ORAL HISTORY INTERVIEW

Sarah Bellian and Linda McMahan met with Floyd Frank, Mr. and Mrs. Preston Frank, Commissioner “Bo” Alfred and his staff at the Precinct 4 Service Center on Tuesday, October 25, 2016 to record the life of 98 year old Floyd Frank. Floyd has lived in the area around Beaumont all of his life. As a young man, he worked for Boyts, then the McFaddins, on their ranches. Eventually he went into the business of upholstering furniture but continued ranch-related activities of his own, including the Sunday rodeos in Cheek.

In celebration of Archeology Month the Jefferson County Historical Commission hosted Dr. Kerry Nichols, East Texas Regional Archeologist, with the Texas Historical Commission, for a presentation on Wednesday, October 12, 2016, in the Jury Impaneling Room at the Jefferson County Courthouse.

Our appreciation and thanks to Linda McMahan, our coordinator and Secretary/Treasurer for planning this event, and Brenda Jackson, Executive Board member, for recommending and inviting our guest speaker.

Dr. Nichols holds a PhD. in anthropology from the University of Missouri, Columbia, a Master's Degree in Anthropology from the University of Colorado Denver, and a Bachelor's in Political Science and Government from the University of Northern Colorado. He has a broad range of experience from field archaeology to Section 106 reviewer to archivist.

Dr. Nichols presented a prehistoric and historic chronological and cultural background for Southeast Texas Archeology, and also discussed significant recent cultural resource management projects in our area.

The regional workshop was attended by representatives of several area county historical commissions and interested members of the public. All attendees learned about the important work conducted at area archaeological sites and about how these studies contribute to our understanding of the prehistory and history of southeast Texas.
