The Handbook of Texas mentions some of the archeological sites located within our county which include six burial mounds discovered at the site of the Grigsby plantation at Port Neches which may be attributed to the Atakapa Indians and pottery shards found on Sabine Lake. Paul Tanner, our own JCHC member, found and documented many artifacts on McFaddin Beach. Scientific archeological digs have been conducted at the French House site and the historic site of Gladys City near Spindletop. Recently local media inquired about a cache of old bottles found during road work near the Beaumont Yacht Club which may be the site of the City of Beaumont's old landfill. We never know what discoveries lay ahead!

Average farm size in Jefferson County in 1930's. During the Great Depression owner and tenant farmer numbers were almost equal in numbers. Rice, cotton, corn, other feed crops, figs, and truck crops were all grown.
