## **LOCAL E-FILING PRACTICES:**

## **General Information**

- Courts are integrated with efile.txcourts.gov accepted filings are instantly entered in local case management system.
- Multiple Filing Codes per filing submission are suggested.
- Documents submitted as Attachments will NOT be file marked. Documents submitted as multiple Lead Documents under the same Filing Code will not be file marked.

## **Initial & Subsequent Filings**

- Exhibits that are meant to be filed with a pleading should **not** be submitted as Attachments they should be scanned with the pleading in which they are referenced.
- Requests for citations, copies, service, etc. are available under Optional Services. A Request form should be filed for all request to prepare issuance and citation TRCP 99(a)
- The addresses of the parties in all civil, probate and guardianship actions are required under §30.015, Civil Practice & Remedies Code.
- Each document should be submitted as a separate Filing Code & Lead Document so that they will be properly indexed in the local case management system. After filing each document you will have to select NEW FILING for each additional document.
- The Filing Description and Lead Document Description should be indexed the same by the submitter using Proper Case
  - Example: FILING CODE= <u>Application</u> FILING DESCRIPTION= <u>Application for Ad Litem</u> DOCUMENT DESCRIPTION= Application for Ad Litem
- Proposed orders shall be filed as PROPOSED ORDER as the Filing Code, and indexed as the Filing & Document Description.
